Berlin, Oct. 29.—Editor Maximilian Harden of Zukunft was acquitted today on the charge of libeling Count Von Moltke, who in turn was ordered to pay the costs.

On leaving the court room he was greeted by a chorus of hoots and vile epithets. The police beat back the throng that was threatening him.

TALKED TOO MUCH IN PRAYER MEETING

Brattleboro Man Invokes Aid of American Flag in Allowing to Give His Testimony as Long as He Wishes.

Brattleboro, Oct. 29.—Sidney Holt of Esteyville, for many years a character in Brattleboro, a man whose hair hangs in luxuriant folds upon his shoulders, is a constant attendant at religious services in the various fraternal churches, particularly the prayer meetings in the Methodist church, of which Rev. A. H. Webb is pastor.

His remarks at the Methodist prayer meeting Sunday night were somewhat out of the ordinary. They brought out the fact that he had been spoken to about taking up so much time, not only by some of the officers of the church, but by the chief of the police, to whom complaint had been made.

The time which he occupied in giving his testimony at this meeting is declared by members of the congregation to be 15 minutes, and Rev. Mr. Webb, after the speaker had finished, and before the meeting was closed, was constrained to tell the story of a woman who prayed so long that when she sat down another worshipper remarked that her prayer was all right for eternity.

RED STAR STEAMER BUCKED BREAKWATER

ROGERS IS GUILTY. FIRST DEGREE MURDER

Find the Jury in Case of New York Man Charged With Killing Fred R. Olney, Two Years Ago.

Groton, N. Y., Oct. 29.—Charles N. Rogers was convicted of murder in the first degree here last night, for killing Fred R. Olney near Middletown, October 6, 1905. Rogers is also under indictment for the murder of Willis Olney and Alice Ingerick at the same time.

Justice Tompkins in his charge thoroughly reviewed the evidence produced at the trial. Respecting the statements of four alibi witnesses that Rogers is of a low order of mentality and that justice would be served by imprisonment for life, Justice Tompkins told the jury not to consider that portion of the evidence.

New York, Oct. 29.—Because he refused when the lot fell to him to dynamite the home of a man who declined to pay a tribute to the "Black Hand," Vito Grenaldi, a member of the society, was cut to pieces by his gang early today.

A dynamite bomb was tucked under his blue sweater, when the body was found, which would have wrecked an ordinary block. Nearby lay the stiletto with which he fought for his life. Some papers in his pockets revealed his affiliation with the "Black Hand" and were probably the cause of his death.
