

## PREFERS JAIL TO HER OWN FAMILY.

Chicago Woman, Accused of Stealing  
Diamonds, Objects to Being Paroled  
With Relatives.

Chicago, Nov. 9.—Miss Rose Haines, who spent a fortune in speculation on the open board of trade, expressed a desire yesterday to remain in the woman's quarters of the county jail rather than be released on parole to a relative living in Wisconsin. "Can't I go back to jail?" she asked. Assistant State Attorney Young after she had pleaded guilty to two charges of grand larceny and Judge Gibbons had ordered her parole. "I have made a good many friends there, and can have a pretty good time. It really is a pleasant home-like place."

Her father was Matthew Haines, from whom she inherited a fortune of \$40,000. She was arrested for stealing diamonds, and has been in jail two months. Her relatives have refused to obtain bonds for her, believing that the imprisonment would have a beneficial effect.

**DIED A VICTIM OF THE  
CONTINUOUS COUNTING OF MONEY**  
Edward H. Hall, New York Cashier, Is  
Infected With Germs That Lurk  
in Bank Notes.

New York, Nov. 9.—Myxodema, a rare disease, which was brought on in his case by the continual contact with paper money, caused the death of Edward H. Hall a life-long resident of this city. Twenty years spent in counting currency infected Mr. Hall with the deadly germs that lurk in the ordinary bank note, and for 10 years prior to his death he had been a sufferer from the strange malady that baffled medical skill.

For more than 20 years he was the principal cashier for Arnold, Constable & Co.

According to his son it was Mr. Hall's custom to moisten his thumbs in counting bills, and years of practice so affected his hands that the skin became hard and dry and cracked open in cold weather. A general thickening of the tissues set in, which was followed by complications involving the kidneys and circulatory system, later developing into Bright's disease.

**INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION.**

Boston, Nov. 11.—The Rev. Reuben Thomas, D. D., who has been pastor of the Harvard Congregational church, at Brookline, for 32 years, died suddenly at his home on Rawson road at 10:30 Saturday morning.

While he had been suffering with pleurisy for the past ten days, his condition was thought to be greatly improved, so much so in fact that at Friday night's prayer meeting it was announced that he would occupy his pulpit Sunday. A sudden attack of heart failure seized him Saturday, and he failed to rally.

**Items of Interest Gleaned from Our  
Exchanges.**

Retail milk dealers in Rutland find that their milk and cream sales are falling off under the advance in price. Their customers are getting even.

Deer appear to realize the open season is passed and are wandering around at will about the meadow back of J. G. Sargent's at Ludlow.

The gross receipts of the Rutland railroad for the month of September were \$314,341.84, an increase of \$40,727.04 over the same month in 1906.

The heavy rains have raised the level of Lake Champlain to a point about as high as was ever known at St. Albans bay. Fall records are greatly exceeded.

Mrs. Harriet Gilbert of Dorset, passed the ninety-third anniversary of her birth last week. Although not in strong health Mrs. Gilbert is bright and cheery. She is an original D. A. R.

An old Ludlow resident says that 23 years ago there was not enough wood and lumber at hand to meet home needs there. Two week seven carloads of lumber were shipped from Ludlow.

A reprint of the census for 1790 taken in Vermont shows that it reported 16 slaves, which was an error at the original returns. About 16 persons reported as "free colored" were classified as slaves.

Edith Wrenney, a small Pownal youngster, tried to swallow an open safety pin which stuck in her throat. A North Adams, Mass., physician succeeded in dislodging the pin after the parents had tried and failed.

The Rev. Francis Crociata, pastor of the new Italian Catholic church in Rutland, is setting a good example by working with the members of his parish in digging the cellar. The building which will be of Italian architecture will cost about \$15,000. There are about 500 members in the parish which includes the Italians in Center Rutland.

Mr. and Mrs. Chaney O. Green of Troy, N. Y., who November 6 celebrated the sixtieth anniversary of their marriage, were married in Danby November 6, 1847. There was not a foot of railroad track in Vermont at that time. The newly wedded couple journeyed from Danby to Troy by stage coach and took up their residence in West Troy. They have been for many years respected and influential residents of Troy. Mrs. Green's maiden name was Elizabeth Eggleston.

In assembly Friday Principal Thomas of Burlington high school spoke a few words about the athletic situation at the school. He said that the students had the wrong idea about the disbanding of the football team, but the rule made with the outside schools compelled them to keep players off the team who were behind in their studies. The faculty were as sorry as were the students to have the team disbanded and it is the duty of the managers in the future to see that all candidates keep up in their work.

**Bennington Man Struck By Train.**  
Roy Brown of Bennington, while driving a truck team over the bulkhead crossing at Cashiers, Mass., Wednesday was struck by the New York express and had several rods over a high fence down an embankment and into a pond. His head was badly cut, and he was taken on the same train to North Adams, Mass. hospital. C. H. Plumb, of Bennington, the proprietor of the team in the charge of Brown, was driving another team in advance. The second team had several rods over a high fence over when the engine struck the wagon. The two teams were returning from Pittsfield, Mass., where they had been with goods. The second team had a covered top and the storm was beating which prevented the sound of the whistle being heard. Mr. Lecky, frequently walks to Rutland and says that the trip does not hurt him very much. He is popularly known to the young people of the town as Santa Claus because of his long white whiskers.

During his eleven years' residence in Mendon Mr. Lecky has passed a good deal of time in the woods chopping. Last spring he cut and split two and one-half cords of wood. Every winter he goes on the road selling medicine from house to house in the mountain districts, always walking, and he covers many miles in the course of a week.

Mr. Lecky was born in Swanton and is a Civil War veteran, being a survivor of the sixth and eighth Vermont regiments. He went to Mendon from Braintree. Mr. Lecky has, beside Mrs. Stafford, another daughter, Miss Lilla Lecky, of Mendon, and a son, Eleazar, of Vershire.

**Explosion Made Business Lively.**  
Swanton, Nov. 9.—The explosion at the Robin Hood Ammunition company's plant last August, in which the leading machines were knocked out, has caused an accumulation of unloaded shells. While the loading machines are catching up and pending the taking of the annual inventory next week, about 30 hands employed in the shell room have been let go. The total number on the pay roll, however, is about 35 more than a year ago. The season for shot shell is practically over and now the machines that loaded the metal shells, a staple of the year around, are being run over time. It is stated that the plant is millions of shells behind in this branch of its work.
