BEFORE 30,000 PEOPLE

"IN GOD WE TRUST" MOTTO

Heavy Pressure on Congress—Christian Endeavor Organizations All Over the Country Prepared to Agitate the Question.

Washington, Nov. 29.—Plans for a great national movement to force restoration of the motto "In God We Trust" on the coins were energetically started here Wednesday night at a meeting of the citizenship department of the Christian Endeavor union of the District of Columbia.

The resolutions will furthermore call on all Christian organizations, churches, and Christian societies of every sort, as well as individuals, to co-operate in securing such legislation as will insure permanent retention of the motto.

Wednesday night's action was taken after a careful investigation of the facts by the legislative committee of the citizenship department of the Christian Endeavor union.
