CHINA...LDS FOR HER RIGHTS. Asks Japan to Suppress Traffic in Munitions of War. Peking, March 10.—A complete agreement between China and Japan as to the seizure of the steamship Tatsu has not been reached yet. The Chinese Foreign Office maintains that the case cannot be settled without a thorough inquiry into the facts. A member of the Foreign Board had a long conference yesterday with the Japanese Minister, Baron Hayaashi, in regard to the disposal of the cargo of the Tatsu. China proposes that the arms and ammunition be recalled by Japan and the shipping permit issued for its removal. It also makes pledges from Japan for the suppression of the Japanese traffic in munitions of war to the mainland of China. Japan has intimated her willingness to consider this proposition.
