MOB LYNCHES A WHITE MAN.

And Starts For Jail Twenty Miles Away For Two More Victims.

Bristol, Va., March 11.—Jackson Presler, a young married man, has been taken from his home near Swords Creek in Russell County, in spite of his wife's appeal, by a mob of 300 men and hanged to a tree. George Call and John Muttter were murdered at a dance Saturday night and it was charged that Presler was implicated in the killing. Thomas Gross and Fred Dye, young men also charged with being connected in the double crime, were arrested Sunday and hurried to the Lebanon jail, twenty miles away, in order to prevent lynching.

Chattanooga, Tenn., March 11.—A message from Lebanon states that news had been received there that the mob which lynched Jackson Presler in Russell county was being increased and was on its way to Lebanon with a view to lynching Gross and Dye, the two men in jail for the same crime of which Presler was accused. The sheriff immediately increased the guard around the jail, and a battle is expected in the event of the mob reaching Lebanon. On account of the remoteness of Swords Creek, which is in the mountain district, it has been impossible to get details of the double murder.

BRITISH NAVY TO BE SUPREME.

It Is Not to Be Exceeded by Germany, Says Asquith.

London, March 11.—The comparative strength of the navies of Great Britain and Germany was again brought to the front yesterday in the House of Commons by the debate on the naval estimates, and it drew from Herbert H. Asquith, the acting premier, a reassertion of the intention of the government to maintain Great Britain's unassailable supremacy at sea. Mr. Asquith admitted that if Germany's present program was carried out, she would have thirteen Dreadnoughts and Invincibles to Great Britain's twelve by November, 1911, assuming that Great Britain failed to lay down ships in 1909 to be completed prior to that date. Without forecasting the naval program for next year, Mr. Asquith said he could promise without the faintest hesitation that if the government found a reasonable probability of the German program being carried out, in the way the paper figures suggested, it would provide not only for an additional number of ships, but that they be laid down by such a date as to make sure that the suggested superiority of Germany would not become a fact.

WOUNDED NIGHT RIDER FOUND DYING IN ROAD.

Two Horses Dead Near Him and Three Empty Shotguns.

Clarksville, Tenn., March 11.—Near Woodford, about fifteen miles from this city, Brown Bennett, a young man, the son of an association tobacco planter, was found early yesterday in the public road in a dying condition, with a bullet hole through his head. Near Bennett were two dead horses and three empty shotguns. It is believed that young Bennett was a "night rider," and was shot down by parties whom he and his gang had attacked, and that his comrades, in their haste to get away, had left him dying on the scene of the fight.

RECALLED FROM PERSIA.

Turkish Ambassador at Teheran Ordered Home by the Sultan.

Odesa, March 11.—The Turkish ambassador to Persia, Chems Ud Din Bey, passed through this city yesterday on his way from Teheran to Constantinople. He declared he had been temporarily recalled from Teheran by the Sultan on account of the recent outrage and he added that he had received several letters threatening his life. The ill feeling in Teheran against the Turkish ambassador arises from the fact that Turkish troops have invaded Persian territory and committed depredations. The embassy at Teheran was closed. Two steamers containing war material and having on board two battalions of the Fifty-sixth Russian Infantry, left here yesterday for ports in the Caspian. The actual destination of the men and arms is not known.

NO HURRY ON REVISION

Payne Inclined to Wait for Convention

HE DENIES STORY OF PLAN

For Early Proceedings—Would Let the Tariff Go to Next Session—His Attitude Not Generally Indorsed in Congress.

Washington, March 11.—Chairman Payne of the House committee on ways and means yesterday threw a bomb into the camp of the industrial Republican senators and representatives who have been spreading the report lately that everything has been fixed for the early beginning of work looking to the revision of the tariff. According to these men a number of experts in the various executive departments are soon to be authorized to collect certain statistical facts relating to schedules, to be used as a foundation for a new tariff bill to be drafted by Congress immediately on re-assembling in December. It was further asserted that the president had approved this project, and that it had the indorsement of the party leaders in both houses, including Chairman Payne.

That story is absolutely untrue, so far as it relates to me," declared Chairman Payne with considerable warmth yesterday when he was told what the revisionists are saying. "I am tactically opposed to the whole thing. The country will have trouble enough to manage with this presidential campaign coming on right on the heels of a panic. I am opposed to any action regarding the tariff until the Republican party declares itself on the subject in the national convention. If the party wants revision its leaders will say so at Chicago, and they will draft a plank for the platform setting forth how the tariff ought to be revised. Nobody's interests will suffer by letting the latter go over until the next session."

Despite the ire of Chairman Payne, his attitude is not representative of that of some of the most influential Republicans of both branches of Congress. The stand taken by Payne and Dabzell, they say, has been more reactionary than is well for the party, and they feel that it will be good politics for Congress to recognize in some manner the general opinion that important changes in the tariff should be made. The partisan view of Payne and Dabzell, they say, favors too much of politics, and doubtfully politics at that, and too little of business. It is hoped that some harmonious arrangement will yet be reached which will permit a start to be made toward investigation of tariff conditions at home and abroad, if nothing more.

CALLS ON PRESIDENT.

Aldrich at White House About Currency Bill.

Washington, March 11.—Senator Aldrich, chairman of the Senate finance committee and author of the pending currency bill, had a conference yesterday with the president at the White House. Mr. Aldrich has not been accustomed to visit the White House except by invitation. It is known that the president is taking a keen interest in the Aldrich bill and that he has urged a number of senators to vote for this measure, or at least for a measure recognizing railroad and public bonds as a basis of emergency currency.

AMERICANS THE DIAMOND WEARERS OF THE WORLD

Almost Three-fourths of Production Is Bought by the United States.

Washington, March 11.—Americans are the diamond wearers of the world, according to Consul-General Dierdorff of Antwerp in a report. Almost three-fourths of the world's production of diamonds are bought by the people of the United States.

TRACKS UNDER WATER

And Fish Swim in Kitchen Out in Indiana.

Chicago, March 11.—This afternoon will see the valleys of the Little Calumet and Kankakee rivers under water unless the flood subsides, according to information received this morning from Hammond, Ind. South of Black Oak the Nickel Plate tracks are under seven inches of water for a distance of a mile and a quarter. Several hundred workmen have been pushed to the threatened spot and worked all last night to bolster up the track and roadbed with gravel, slag and sandbags. Unless the water recedes to-day it will be necessary to abandon the track temporarily. Two men who attempted to drive from Gary to Black Oak were almost drowned. They were saved by several men who went into the water up to their necks. A family living between Lansing and the river found carp swimming in the kitchen yesterday morning, with the water three feet deep.

FOR BAKER INQUEST.

Five Witnesses Leave Boston to Give Testimony.

Boston, March 11.—Five witnesses left here yesterday to attend the inquest in New Jersey on the death of Walter F. Baker, of this city. Edward F. Baker, the dead man's brother, left Boston at midnight. His testimony is expected to be of the greatest importance. Lawyer Nay, Mr. Baker's counsel, who has done much work upon the case, started at 1 o'clock for New York with Dr. Ross, the Harvard medical expert, who says that he found arsenic in Walter Baker's stomach. COOL IN FACE OF THREAT TO BLOW BANK TO ATOMS.

Let's Talk It Over, Said Omaha Official to Man Who Produced Bottle He Said Contained Nitro-Glycerine.

Omaha, March 11.—J. J. Fee of this city entered the Merchants' National bank here yesterday and asked to see Vice-President Luther Drake in his private office. Drake seated himself opposite the man, who began talking in a rambling manner about having had \$5,000 in the National Bank of Commerce, Kansas City, when that bank failed. "And since all you fellows are in together, you just hand me over my money or I'll blow you and this bank and all of us to hell," said Fee, producing a three-ounce bottle of a thick yellow liquid. "Don't you make a move, this is filled with nitro-glycerine. If you move you are a dead man," he shouted. "You don't want to die yourself, do you?" coolly asked Drake.

"Oh, yes. I came in here ready to die," responded Fee. "But when I die I'll kill everybody in this building with me." Drake told his visitor he would talk it over with him, and noticing that the man seemed thin and pinched, Drake asked him if he wasn't hungry. "I have not eaten a thing for 48 hours," answered the man with the bottle. "Well, let's go have breakfast and talk this over," proposed Drake.

President Hamilton of the bank entered the next room during the conversation and heard enough of it to enable him to know what was going on. As Drake and Fee left the room together, Hamilton telephoned the police station for plain clothes men and followed the two men to a restaurant. Drake and Fee were on opposite sides of the table, when three detectives accompanied by Hamilton entered the room. Slipping up behind Fee, the detectives pinned his arms and relieved him of his dangerous bottle before he knew what was up. He was then taken to the police station, where he refused to talk. The bottle has been sent to a chemist for an examination.

ALFONSO AT BARCELONA.
