

GREAT RALLY IN THE 11TH

Gave Boston a Victory Over Cleveland, 8 to 4

SCORED FIVE TIMES AT LAST

Cy Young Was the Winning Pitcher, Keeping Hits Well Scattered Except During the First Inning—Other League Scores.

Cleveland, June 11.—By a splendid 11th hour, or inning rally, Boston defeated Cleveland in a nice game yesterday by a score of 8 to 4, getting five tallies in the last inning and putting the game way beyond the reach of the Naps.

Up to that inning Liebhardt had been pitching git-edged ball, but the visitors got to him in that inning and pounded out a well-earned victory. Young was hit for the same number of safeties as Liebhardt, which was ten, but had them well scattered with the exception of the first inning, when Cleveland tallied three times on three hits, an error by Wagner and a sacrifice.

Boston tied up the game in the fourth with three scores, and thus it stood until the break came in the eleventh. After Boston's great rally, Cleveland could do no more than to make a single run. The score:
