Simpson Likely to Die. New York, July 15.—Surgeons at Roosevelt hospital, where Dr. James W. Simpson lies critically wounded as the result of a shot alleged to have been fired by his mother-in-law, Mrs. Ella Horner, at Northport, L. I., late yesterday, have not decided whether it would be safe to perform the operation to remove the bullet. Dr. Simpson was conscious this morning. An examination of the wound showed that the shot had penetrated the liver. Physicians say that Dr. Simpson's trip from Northport to the hospital greatly aggravated the wound and may lessen his chance of recovery.

CAUGHT UNDER THEIR OWN CAR. Auto Turns Turtle at Crawford Notch, N. H.—Man Seriously Injured, and Woman Badly Shaken Up. Crawford Notch, N. H., July 14.—An automobile bearing a Connecticut license and carrying the owner, his wife and chauffeur, turned turtle last evening on the road while coming up the Notch, and severely injured the occupants. The party was touring the White Mountain resorts and was on its way to the Crawford house at the time of the accident. Near Notch hill a stick blocked one of the front wheels, and caused the machine to skid. The chauffeur attempted to apply the emergency brake, but it failed to work, and the machine started to go down the hill. The speed began to increase and finally the car toppled over the embankment and turned turtle. The chauffeur managed to jump, but was badly cut. He succeeded in dragging the wife of the owner from under the machine, but could not get to the man, as he had his right arm caught under the front seat and was severely pinned under the machine. The chauffeur ran to the Crawford house, about a mile distant, and several men hastened back to the scene of the accident. A little later Frank Billings of Marlboro, Mass., secured other men and crowbars, and they hurried to where the disabled car had turned turtle. It took but a short time to pry up the car. One of the boys from the Crawford house then crawled under the car and pulled the owner out. His right shoulder was dislocated and he was unconscious, but in a short time he revived.

He opened a shop here on December 20, 1863, in one of the small buildings near where the Central Vermont station is now located and which is now occupied by a stone shed. He remained there 11 years, moved to Elm street into one of the Langdon buildings, where he remained 27 years, and after that building was torn down moved to the Blanchard property overlooking Haymarket square, where he has been eight years.

A Challenge to Sugar Makers. A. C. Leach of Fletcher, one of the most extensive sugar makers in that section, has issued a challenge to the sugar makers of the state for a sap boiling apparatus that will take care of as much sap in one hour, or in ten hours, or produce the same number of gallons of syrup weighing eleven pounds to the gallon as the apparatus which he is now using. The past spring Mr. Leach had an evaporator made according to specifications, scientifically prepared from his own deductions, arrived at from many years' experience in sugar making, and he now champions his apparatus as the best in use today. Mr. Leach stands ready to back his theory in a practical test with any apparatus having the same number of feet of heating surface. The size of his evaporator is 14 by 4 feet.

In the savings department the semi-annual dividend at the rate of 4 per cent. was paid to depositors. The Passumpsic Savings Bank paid its semi-annual dividend of 2 per cent. July 1.

A toy balloon was sent up by A. B. Bracewell of North Brattleboro, Saturday evening July 4, with a request attached that the card be returned to him by the finder, and on Monday the card was returned by Jennie M. Abbott of Putney, saying the balloon was found lodged in the branches of a tree there, the distance being about twelve miles from where it started.

Report of Vermont Sanatorium. Dr. Henry D. Chadwick, superintendent and medical director of the Vermont sanatorium at Pittsford, has issued a statement saying that since the opening of the sanatorium, December 15 last, fifty-three patients have been admitted. Twenty-six of these have been discharged, leaving twenty-seven now under treatment.

The average length of stay of these discharged (disregarding two patients who insisted upon returning home after a stay of a few days) has been fourteen weeks, three days.

Those discharged are classified as follows: Eight apparently cured (five incipient and three moderately advanced); nine disease arrested (three incipient, five moderately advanced, and one far advanced); four improved (two far advanced, one moderately advanced, and one chronic bronchitis—one tubercular); five not improved (three far advanced, one moderately advanced, and one stayed but two days).

Ten of these discharged gained from ten to thirty pounds each, six from five to ten pounds, seven from one and one-half pounds to five pounds. Three made no gain.

The patients now under treatment are classified as twelve incipient, ten moderately advanced, and five far advanced.

The geographical distribution of all patients thus far received is as follows: Addison county, 12; Rutland 15; Bennington, 3; Chittenden, 4; Windham, 4; Washington, 6; Franklin, 1; Windsor, 5; Orleans, 1; Grand Isle, 1; Caledonia, 1.

Aged Fair Haven Woman Dead. Mrs. Mary Potter of Fair Haven, who died June 28, after four months' illness, was born in Clarendon, and last winter celebrated her ninety-third birthday anniversary. Most of her long life was passed in the town of her birth, Benson, and in Fair Haven. She retained her faculties unimpaired to the end of her days. Her husband, David Potter, died in Benson in 1875. Mrs. Potter is survived by three daughters, Miss Eliza Potter and Mrs. A. J. Dorman, of Fair Haven, and Mrs. A. J. Spring of Ames, Iowa, and by one son, Eugene Potter, of Hubbardton.

Rutland, July 15.—The annual meeting of the Rutland County Medical and Surgical society was held at the parlors of The Berwick in this city yesterday. Bellerose, who is abroad. The most interesting part of the program was the lecture given by Dr. George William Warren of the Presbyterian hospital, New York, on "Diseases of the Kidneys." He told in a highly entertaining way the correct manner of diagnosing cases where the kidneys are affected. The local physicians extended him a vote of thanks for his address.
