The portable steam mill of Walter Ingraham was destroyed by fire at Williamsville Thursday morning. Mr. Ingraham had built a fire in a small stove to heat water for the gasoline engine while he was at breakfast and the first he knew his property was in flames. He carried no insurance but will rebuild at once.

The Federal Packing company's first plant in Enosburg Falls develops so promisingly that the stockholders have voted to increase the company's capital from \$100,000 to \$500,000. The O'Flaherty factory has been leased for the term of years. Among the directors and stockholders of the company, says the New York Commercial Bulletin, are some of the best known packers in the country, identified especially with the milk business.

Orrin Gray, section foreman for the Boston & Maine railroad at Squam, Barton, narrowly escaped death Wednesday night by being struck by the 'helicopter' running backwards on its return trip from the Summit to Newport. The sleigh was demolished and Gray was found unconscious 100 feet from the crossing. His right ankle was crushed and a great gash cut on his head in addition to other injuries.

Beatty Sues N. Y. Tribune. Beatty S. Bealister of Brattleboro has brought suit to recover \$100,000 damages from the New York Tribune for alleged libel. The trouble arises out of legal difficulties between Mrs. Agnes H. Baker of Cleveland, Ohio, and Mr. Bealister over the lease of Mrs. Baker's farm. When Mrs. Baker brought suit early in December, Mr. Bealister was arrested and released under bonds for appearance in county court. The Tribune published a despatch stating that Mr. Bealister had been arrested on the charges of larceny of chickens and fertilizer from the farm. The arrest was simply a matter of form in a civil suit and was not made on any criminal charge. When the article appeared, Mr. Bealister directed his attorneys, Bihson & Waterman, to bring suit for libel. Trial will be held in the supreme court of New York State but the condition of the docket is such that the case will not be reached for about a year. In speaking of the case, Mr. Bealister said, "I was once charged with larceny of chickens" referring to his troubles with his brother-in-law, Rudyard Kipling, a few years ago "but I have never been guilty of stealing chickens." The New York Tribune despatch was copied widely throughout the country, appearing as far away as Los Angeles and in Texas. Two days after it was published, the editor of the Tribune informed Mr. Bealister's New York attorneys that his first article was not true and that Mr. Bealister had not been arrested on a criminal process.
