A WIDER MOVEMENT. Conservation of Resources For The Whole Continent. Washington, Jan. 30.—Arrangements for the North American Conservation Conference between representatives of the United States, Canada and Mexico, at the White House, February 18, are going forward rapidly, following the cordial acceptance by Sir Wilfred Laurier, Premier, and Earl Gray, Governor-General of Canada, and President Diaz of Mexico, of President Roosevelt's invitation to send delegates. The Conference will discuss the situation with regard to the natural resources of the respective countries and help prepare a general plan adapted to promote the welfare of the Nations concerned in accordance with President Roosevelt's suggestion.

This international conference will meet at the White House by President Roosevelt's invitation. It will not be a large gathering as was the Conference of Governors at the White House last May, or the joint Conservation Conference last December between the National Conservation Commission, the Governors and the representatives of State Conservation Commission and Conservation Committee of National organizations. The attendance will be limited to the representatives of Canada and Mexico and representatives of the State Department and of other Executive Departments which can render particular assistance to the National Conservation Commission, and the National Conservation Commission.

Canada has already taken active steps in preparation for the Conference and recently sent to the National Conservation Commission a number of carefully prepared maps which show the present status of the public lands of the Dominion as well as the distribution of the principal natural resources and the development of its transportation system. The Canadian authorities have also gathered together and sent to the Chairman of the Commission a comprehensive collection of Government documents bearing on the natural resources of the country. These have been carefully indexed and bound together according to subjects. They will be used at the forthcoming Conference.

President Roosevelt feels that the connection between the United States and the two Nations which lie to the North and South is so intimate that they can consider their mutual interests with regard to natural resources from the standpoint of the general welfare of the Continent with small regard to the political boundary lines which separate them. Indeed, it is said that he considered inviting Canada and Mexico to the first Conservation Conference at the White House, but that he refrained from doing so because he was unwilling to run the risk of associating themselves with the Conservation movement before it was certain that it was going to succeed.

Now that success is assured he feels that since the two Nations have identical interests and identical aspirations they can work together along Conservation lines just as the representatives of the States work together without regard to State boundaries. ABOUT THE STATE. D. H. Sargent of Swanton announces the marriage engagement of his daughter, Mae Clair Sargent, and Clarence Edward Sawyer of Burlington. H. M. Stevenson of Barre has patented a device by which a window shade may be lowered from the top, permitting the shade to be lowered at the top while the rest of the window remains shaded. Mr. Stevenson has thought up other things and it is said that the first idea of a new planter, an implement now so common, was the invention of Mr. Stevenson. Clarence Smith of Morrisville who lives on the cross road from Tenney bridge to the Elmore road, was arrested Wednesday by Officer Bryant and taken before Justice A. A. Niles in the office of State's Attorney F. F. Maurice, charged with cruelty to animals. Smith was fined \$35 and costs. The fine is suspended and he is in the hands of the probation officer for one year. The costs were paid by Smith.

Mrs. Donald Sage Mackay of New York, widow of the distinguished clergyman who was pastor of the Congregational church at St. Albans some years ago, had engaged passage on the White Star steamer Republic but was compelled to cancel her reservation on account of illness. Her steamer was exactly at the point of collision between the Republic and the Florida. Mrs. Mackay is the sister of former Gov. E. C. Smith of St. Albans. The first church in St. Johnsbury and one of the few in that section of the state to employ a deaconess is Grace Methodist Episcopal church of which the Rev. Joshua M. Frost is pastor. This church now numbers 400 members and has 2,000 names on its parish list, and the rapid growth during the past few years has necessitated this addition to the working force. Deaconess Ida L. Kahlo will begin her work the first of February, and has been engaged for a six months period.

The annual village report of Richford shows the trustees disbursed last year \$11,123.47 and that the total indebtedness of the village is \$5,731.12, an increase for the year of \$5,012.87, due to a new house and over a mile of concrete sidewalks. A tax of 55 cents is recommended of which 21 cents is for a sinking fund. The new house cost, practically, \$6,100.98, of which \$5,000 was appropriated by the village. The cost of the water system was \$6,825.05. The floating debt is \$7,800, and the cash on hand is \$907.77, or \$346.95 more than one year ago. It is probable that the floating debt of the village, outside of the water system will be refunded by bonding in accordance with a law passed by the legislature.

RECENT DEATHS OF VERMONTERS. The funeral of Thomas D. Rood was held at his late home in Milton Wednesday at 1:00 p. m., the Rev. E. E. Herman officiating. Two hymns were read by the Congregational choir. Mr. Rood had been a life-long resident of Milton and was 84 years old. He leaves a wife and five children, Dr. I. D. Rood of Des Moines, Iowa, Milo, of Malone, N. Y., Miss Gertrude of Hartford, Conn. and Miss Mary of Bridgeport, Conn. and Arthur of Milton whom he leaves a widow and five children. The funeral was held at the Congregational church. The burials were Eugene Town, Charles L. and Willard Sanderson and J. S. Benham and interment was in the family lot in the village cemetery. Among those from out of town were his nephew and niece, George W. Burnham of Brandon, Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Jones and Mrs. O. B. Landon of Johnson and Dennis Rood of Jericho.

MISS FLIGLIA V. BENSON died Wednesday afternoon after a long illness, at the home of her niece, Mrs. Della Moody in Stowe where she had been cared for a few weeks. Miss Benson was 78 years of age, and had always resided in Stowe. She was one of the seven children of Joseph and Eliza Benson, the only survivor being Mary Benson, who with her sister has resided at the Benson home on Maple street for more than 40 years. The funeral was held at Mrs. Moody's residence Friday afternoon.

SMALL ICE CUT IN NEW ENGLAND. Harvest Only One-fifth That of Other Years. Boston, Jan. 30.—A falling off in the cut is reported generally from the ice harvesting sections of New England where operations are now at their height. The weather this winter has not been favorable to extensive operations of good quality of ice. On the Penobscot and Kennebec rivers in Maine, where the cut is controlled by the Charles H. Scott & Co., the estimated ice harvest this year is not expected to exceed 100,000 tons. This is less than one-fifth of the size of the harvests that have been made on these rivers in former years.
