A discussion of extensive improvements and plans to put the road on a paying basis before winter followed but the extending of the line to Morrisville was not decided upon.

GOES TO SUPREME COURT.

Petition of Mrs. A. F. Sparrow of Pittsboro For Custody of Child.
Bristol, April 14.—A hearing on the petition of Mrs. A. F. Sparrow of Pittsboro, Penn., for the custody of her daughter, Helen, aged seven, on habeas corpus proceedings, took place before Judge F. M. Butler of Rutland Monday afternoon.
The child was taken from her home by her father last February and taken to Bellows Falls where she was adopted by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Sparrow, without the mother's knowledge or consent. Counsel for the child's mother claims that the child was illegally detained and that the statute under which she was adopted was unconstitutional.
Judge Butler said that he had decided that the mother's rights could not be ignored and that he should order that the mother be given the custody of the child, but as the counsel on the other side wished to petition the supreme court for the privilege of introducing testimony, Judge Butler arranged to have the case brought to the attention of the supreme court without making a formal order.
He said the question involved was entirely new in this state. The child will remain with her mother in Bristol until the case is disposed of.

IN LOCAL MARKETS

Maple Sugar Only Fair in Quality AND IN QUANTITY SCARCE

WHEAT STILL ADVANCING.
May, July and September Options Make New High Records in Chicago Today.

Chicago, April 14.—Wheat for delivery in May, July and September established new high record marks at the opening of the board of trade yesterday. May wheat opened at from 1.27 to 1.28, July rose early to 1.17, an advance over yesterday of 1/4 cent. September touched 1.09, a gain of 3/4 cent over night.

The Liverpool market furnished the bulk news of the hour, and other European markets advanced sympathetically. The rail influence, however, was a general belief that there is a world-wide shortage of wheat. Reports of favorable weather for the growing crop in the winter wheat belt was ignored.

The opening flurry in May was due, it is said, to the closing out of the May contracts of Ennis & Stoppini, the brokers of New York and Chicago against whom an involuntary petition in bankruptcy was filed in New York today. The amount involved here is said to have been large.

Feed, Forestry, Fertilizers, Fruit.
The Vermont experiment station is distributing this month four bulletins and two circular dealing with the topics above mentioned.

Number 138 gives the results of the inspection of feeding stuffs and discusses the visibility of weed seeds in feeds after they have been eaten and voided in the manure.

Number 139, the first publication from the office of the new state forester, is a preliminary statement as to the forest problems of the state, and contains announcements as to the offerings of seedlings for this year's plantings.

Number 140 is the first fertilizer bulletin and contains analyses of 56 brands, together with statements as to valuations, etc.

Number 141 deals with apple culture in Vermont and discusses this subject in all its phases.

Circular 1 describes the back issues of the fertilizer control.

Circular 2 describes, illustrates and warns Vermonters against the gypsy and hawthorn leaf moths.

These publications or any of them will be sent without charge to any address on application. Parties not hitherto receiving the station bulletins regularly and desiring them should ask to have their names placed on the mailing list. A postal card to the Experiment Station, Burlington, Vt., stating desires, is sufficient.
