**ABOUT THE STATE**  
Messrs. Davis and Davis, Washington patent attorneys report the granting of a patent on a vending machine to E. X. Somers of St. Johnsbury.  
E. J. Ormsbee, an executor of Lydia C. Case's estate, Brandon, has filed his account which shows that the Baptist church, as residuary legatee, received about \$5,800, which includes a legacy of \$1,000 under the will of Mrs. Case.  
The financial budget prepared by Mayor H. C. Carpenter of Rutland, calling for \$106,000, was voted by the board of aldermen to \$37,000. Without the water money for use in other departments, the city faces a deficit of over \$20,000.

There are now 55 men enlisted in Company F, 1st Inf., V. N. G., Northfield, this being within three of the full quota, and several others are contemplating enlistment. The average age of the new men is considerably older than in recent years. Four drills held last week under Capt. H. C. Moseley with an average attendance of 98 per cent. The Tuttle Co. Suit.  
Concerning the withdrawal of the suit of the Tuttle Co. of Rutland against State Auditor Horace F. Graham, mandamus proceedings to recover the balance of \$832 on a bill for printing for the state, attorney Fred S. Platt of counsel for the Tuttle Co., has said: "When the case was started we supposed that their defense lay in the fact of the alleged comings of printers. This is a question of law and could be taken into the supreme court, but when it was discovered that the defense claimed that the type was of the wrong kind and that some of the printing was not delivered on time we saw there was no use in continuing the case. It is impossible to sue the state. If the case was decided against the state there could be no execution issued."
