FOREST PLANTATIONS.

Are Being Made Throughout Vermont, It Is Reported.

It is significant of the spirit in which the Champlain Arbor day was made the opening, so to speak, of the great tercentenary that 170,000 trees have already been sent out from the Vermont experiment station nursery by the state forester to the people of Vermont. While of course, only a small part of these trees were actually planted on Arbor day, it is interesting to think that when another century shall have passed there will still be numerous forest groves testifying to the interest in the subject of forest planting awakened in the year of Champlain's tercentenary. Trees are being taken these trees in quantities varying from 500 to 20,000 trees. Owing to the heavy drain on the state nursery last year, most of the trees furnished are three-year-old white pines imported from Germany, but several thousand Scotch pines, Norway spruce and black locust have also been sold. The movement are Windsor with 60,000 trees and Windham with 40,000 trees. Of the towns Woodstock has the lead with 43,000 trees, having the two most extensive plantations of the state, Hon. Geo. Aiken in charge of the Billings estate and Mr. A. L. Powers.

Owing to the lateness of the season forest planting can be safely undertaken this year as late as the first week of June.
