IRON ENOUGH FOR 400 YEARS.
World-Supply Found in Chinese Mines—Awtow Workings Resumed.
Amoy, China, May 25.—There is renewed activity in the development of the Awtow iron mines, located 50 miles northwest of Tauntau. Work on this enterprise has been suspended for the past 10 months, because of the exorbitant royalties demanded by the government, from 30 to 50 per cent, and as a result of the Japanese protest against the employment of other than Japanese engineers.
These difficulties now have been removed. British or American engineers are to be employed and the payment of royalties has been temporarily suspended. They may be later assessed at from 5 to 20 per cent of the output.
An old report by an English expert says that the magnetic iron ore at these mines is 90 per cent, pure, and sufficient to supply the world for four centuries. The Awtow district is rich in coal, lead, limestone and other minerals, and the distance to tidewater is only 50 miles.
A Chinese company was organized about a year and a half ago to operate the properties mentioned in the above

KILLS WOMAN; ATTEMPTS SUICIDE
Lima, O., Lawyer Shoots Himself When Pursued by Officers.
Lima, O., May 25.—John W. Beam, a well known lawyer and real estate dealer, who was sought by the police on the charge of murdering Mrs. Estella M. White, a young widow who was shot and instantly killed in her doorway Sunday night, attempted to end his own life yesterday. Beam is in a serious condition at a hospital. Immediately following the shooting the police sought Beam. The chase continued throughout the night. Early yesterday bloodhounds were used. They led the officers to the Beam home. The man was found in his bath. Upon being ordered to surrender, Beam fired. The shot did not take effect upon any of his pursuers. Beam ran behind the barn and turned the revolver upon himself. He was found unconscious and taken to a hospital.

More Than 100 Leave Work at Manchester Depot Mills.
Manchester, May 25.—Because the company refused to grant them a nine hour day with 10 hours' pay, more than 100 employees of the Norcross & West Marble mill at Manchester Depot struck last Friday afternoon, but indications are that those who already have not returned to work would soon do so.
When the demand of the men was made known to the officials of the company, it was met with a proposition to give nine hours' pay for 10 hours' work, or 10 hours' pay for 10 hours' work. This was declined by most of the men. Four employees did not join in the strike, and they were out resumed work on Saturday. It is understood that six others agreed to return to their labors. The strikers include polishers, rubbers and cutters.

Asks Questions Which the Senate Must Answer.
Washington, May 25.—Senator Hepburn resumed his speech on the lumber schedule in the Senate yesterday and submitted a large amount of evidence concerning the cost of producing finished lumber and the need for a differential duty.
Senator Hepburn inquired how much it was proposed by the advocates of reduced lumber rates to cut the wages of laborers in the lumber camps. He wanted to know whether it was the mills in the West or South that it was proposed to close.
Only a dozen senators were on the floor.
"The circulation of the Congressional Record is so limited and the interest of the press in this question so small that I prefer to speak to those who must vote on this question," the Idaho senator said. He then questioned the presence of a quorum, and the roll was called. A quorum responded and Mr. Hepburn repeated his question. The silence which followed was broken by the senator declaring: "If you don't answer those questions here, you will answer when election day comes around and you want to hold up to the people the fruits of the Republican party."

Senator Money has also prepared a statement showing the cost of indirect taxation. He states that the cost of granulated sugar in 1900 was 2.05 cents more in New York than in London and that in 1907 the United States consumed 2,983,979 tons of sugar, against which the duty of \$1.95 a hundred pounds was charged, equaling \$130,722,002, while the duty actually collected amounted to \$60,135,181, making the cost to the people above the revenue collected by the government \$70,586,821.
On pig iron, steel rails, wire nails, and steel billets, the differences between the foreign prices and those in the United States equal an additional tax of over \$295,000,000, according to Mr. Money's calculations, which he says are based on a sworn statement submitted to the ways and means committee by Judge Gary of the United States Steel corporation.**
