ABOUT THE STATE The base ball diamond at the Rutland fair grounds will be put in shape this week for next Monday's game with Putney. League base ball seeming doubtful the coming summer, it is planned to re-organize the home talent team which claims to have won the amateur championship of Vermont last season by defeating East Arlington at Manchester in 10 innings. A meeting of members of the team will be held tonight to talk the matter over. Seven town teams have already written for games.

Beginning Sunday a daily milk train will be run to New York over the Rutland railroad from Alburg and all Vermont points on the line. This service will inaugurate the first through trains to the metropolis from Vermont by way of the Chatham division. It has long been the hope of many in Bennington that through Pullman trains would be run over this road from Montreal to New York and thus establish that town on a main railroad line. These milk trains seem to be an advance in that direction, says the Bennington Banner.

Milford, N. H., Quarry to Resume. Milford, N. H., May 26.—The revival of an industry which once ranked among the foremost of its character in the state, is anticipated with the sale of the works of the Milford Granite company. The enterprise was at one time owned by citizens here, but about a year ago the company went into the hands of a receiver and the plant was closed. J. B. Ford of Cambridge, Mass., the purchaser of the plant, has begun the work of renovating it. Before long it is expected that the quarry will again be one of the thriving industries of the place.

STORMED THE SCHOOL. Frantic Mothers Only Kept at Bay With Difficulty. New York, May 26.—A panic stricken mob of 1,000 women, mothers and relatives of the 500 children who attended the large East Side public school at Forsyth and Stanton streets, stormed the doors of the school house yesterday when a fire started in a six-story tenement house adjoining the school. Realizing the serious consequences that would follow if the excited women got inside the schoolhouse, the janitor quickly closed and bolted the doors and the teachers managed to quiet the children. They were all kept inside until the fire was under control. When the excitement had subsided, the children were allowed to depart. No one was injured in the tenement house fire.

ENORMOUS DAMAGE IN STORM. Five Persons Killed, Many Hurt in Oklahoma. Oklahoma City, Okla., May 26.—Five persons are dead, many injured, several thousand acres of crops are inundated and every stream in the northern and eastern part of Oklahoma is raging as a result of heavy rains during the last twenty-four hours. IN LOCAL MARKETS Potatoes are Showing an Advance in Price. New Bedford, Mass., May 26.—The cloth mill operatives of the city, through the Board of Trade, have asked for a restoration of the wage schedule which prevailed early in 1907, and the manufacturers have declined to make the restoration. The manufacturers' answer was received the latter part of last week and so quietly was the movement conducted that only those in close touch with both sides knew that the request had been made. Two years ago wages were reduced in the cloth mills of the city 10 per cent., and at the conference at that time it was understood that when business picked up the schedule then paid would be restored. Thinking the time had arrived, basing their opinion on the numerous mill additions and new mill enterprises under way, the textile council decided to remind the manufacturers of the promise two years ago. The answer was disappointing, for the manufacturers at a meeting held last week decided that the time had not arrived, and that a restoration could not be made at present. It is the claim of the manufacturers that the competition in fine goods, which are the principal line made here, is so sharp that a restoration of the old wage is impossible.
