PARISIAN SWEETMEAT.

Old Time French Delicacy That Will Add Novelty to Today's Menu.

Here, clipped from an old French cookbook, is the recipe for that Parisian delicacy "pommes a la Parisienne" (apple fantasy):

Peel, core and slice thinly three pounds of apples.

Place an ounce of butter in a clean enameled iron stewpan, and as soon as it boils add the apples, together with eight sugar to taste, the juice of half a lemon from ripe and a wineglassful of claret.

Stew very slowly until quite tender.

Then place in the bottom of a fancy pie dish.

Whisk four eggs, the whites and yolks separately, to a stiff froth. Add to them a small cupful of grated bread or sponge cake crumbs which have been well soaked in milk. Add grated nutmeg and sifted sugar to taste.

Cover the apples with this mixture and bake until of a light golden brown hue.

Turn out upside down on a fancy dish.

Cover with sifted sugar and then with a lattice-work of strips of thinly cut angelica.

This sweet is equally good served hot or cold.

FOR THE EPICURE.

A Light Dessert and a Pick-me-up Soup.

To make the best of all light desserts, French panache, one needs two fresh eggs, two tablespoonfuls of milk, one tablespoonful of self raising flour and one tablespoonful of castor sugar.

Put the flour in a basin, add the sugar and mix it well in. Make a hole in the flour, add the eggs, previously lightly beaten, and beat it all together. Have ready two buttered saucers; put half the mixture in each, bake in a moderate oven for fifteen minutes till a golden-brown and then spread with apricot or strawberry jam, turn each over, like a half moon, and serve very hot.

HE OBEYED ORDERS.

Green corn soup is a splendid pick-me-up on a cold night. To make it take all the white part from a head of celery and a medium sized onion and cut into small dice, put into a saucepan with two plants of milk and cook until perfectly tender; then add the contents of a tin of corn, boil up again and run through a sieve; season with pepper, salt and a small blade of mace; add half a pint of boiled milk and stir in gently the beaten yolks of two eggs. Boil about one ounce of macaroni in salted water till perfectly tender (twenty minutes), cut it into small pieces and serve in the soup as a garnish.

HE OBEYED ORDERS.

Curled celery is an attractive garnish. Cut thick stalks of celery to two inch pieces. With a sharp knife, beginning at the outside of the stalks, make five cuts parallel to each other extending one-third the length of the pieces. Make six cuts at right angles to the cuts already made. Cut the other end in the same fashion. Put the pieces in cold or iced water and let stand for several hours.
