Herbert E. F. Horton, who has been abroad for several months, studying in sculpture, returned from Paris March 5, and came to Brattleboro to visit his father, Frank C. Horton. He returned this week to New York to resume his studies with Herbert Adams, the sculptor, with whom he has been associated since the death of Augustus St. Gaudens. Mr. Horton was employed by St. Gaudens upon work which was uncompleted on the death of the latter.

The Premier Automobile company, located in Rutland for the last five years, and the J. H. Prentiss & Son company, manufacturers of sand pumps and sand feeding machinery, located there for 23 years, has practically decided to move its business from that place to Springfield, Mass., where a more extensive plant will be built. The facilities at Brattleboro in Springfield for an increase in the size of the business than Rutland. It was surprising to see her figure in a beginners' competition; in fact, her form was so good that she scored about 22 marks out of 25 for the lowest test, for which she entered on the following day." Mrs. Swift was formerly Miss Ethel Dalton of Brattleboro, and while a resident of that town she was rated by good judges as one of the best women tennis players in this country.

The town of Jamaica, at the March meeting, voted to exempt the Jamaica Glove company for a term of five years. This company has a promising industry well started and is engaged in the manufacture of canvas gloves, the output being largely disposed of in Vermont. Six machines operated by gasoline power are now in use, and it is expected that about 20 additional ones will be installed during the coming season, and when these are in operation 30 or 40 hands will be employed. At the present time, about a dozen hands have regular work. The operators of the machines are women, and some have employment at their own homes, sewing the gloves on their own power machines. This industry had a small beginning, having been started by George Harrington two years ago when a single machine.

James J. Phelan of Boston has been chosen as president of the Connecticut Valley Lumber company, to succeed the late George Van Dyke. Mr. Phelan will have his office in Boston and will personally attend to the financial affairs of the concern. For the year ending January 31, 1909, the company cut some 40,000,000 feet of timber from its properties in northern New Hampshire and Vermont. This winter's crop of logs will be about 55,000,000 feet, of which 10,000,000 will be driven down the Connecticut river to Mt. Tom to be cut into lumber, the balance of 45,000,000 feet having been sold as pulp-wood. This is one of the largest drives ever sent down the river. In the winter just closing, 1,000 men and 500 horses have been employed in preparing the timber for the streams, and this spring there will be some 400 men in the

Newport, March 24.—A very interesting case was brought to a close yesterday in Orleans county court, when the jury after being out all night, brought in a verdict for Miss Alice A.
