PLUNDER ON HIGH SEAS. Charge Against Five Americans Held on the Iowa.

Washington, Aug. 24.—On board the battleship Iowa, one of the ships racking up the practice squadron which has just returned to Chesapeake bay with 8500 midshipmen aboard, are five Americans who are held on a charge of plundering a vessel on the high seas.

The prisoners were members of the crew of the American whaling schooner Peiro Varela of New Bedford, Mass. They were placed in jail at Horta, Fayal, at the request of the American consular agent, it is said, and when the naval academy practice squadron passed the Azores it was requested to take the prisoners to the United States.

In addition to the five who are accused of the crime, the Iowa has on board two other members of the crew, who are being held as witnesses. It was said at the navy department yesterday that the prisoners would be turned over to the United States authorities at Annapolis upon the arrival of the Iowa there on Aug. 28.

The Women Aviators Mrs. Sage To Help Them

Especially was she interested in the big biplane being built by Miss E. L. Todd, the woman aviator. The plane is a large one, but Mrs. Sage went over its every detail and showed by her questions to Louis Adams, an inventor who was showing her round, that she understood a great deal about air craft.

"It is very gratifying," said Mrs. Sage, speaking of Miss Todd's effort.

"To see women take up these things, and I am always willing to encourage anything that is done by a woman.

"I have watched Miss Todd's progress with much concern and hope she will succeed in making a successful flying machine. If she needs any more help I am willing to give it to her.

"I am receiving so many letters from people who want help! Yesterday I received four letters from ambitious aviators or aeronauts—which should I call them? I would be willing to help any woman to accomplish something that is worthy, much more than the men."

"Mrs. Sage should decide to help the woman aviators she would already discover a flock of them who have entered the field, some of them wives or sisters of the "man birds" who are flying and others who are determined to be woman birds without waiting for any man to lead the way.

Miss E. Laura Todd of New York is probably the first woman in the world to design and build an aeroplane. This was a collapsible device, which she first made known to the public in the summer of 1908. At that time

while giving no detailed description of the machine, she said it called for a spread of forty-five feet, with a stand of seven feet. The plane was to stand six feet in height and to weigh several hundred pounds less than any other aeroplane of the time. The engine was to be of special design and of exceeding lightness and strength.

Miss Todd not only designs her aeroplanes, but being skilled in the use of tools, is her own model builder.

It is believed that Miss Katherine Wright, sister of the Wright brothers, was the first American woman to make a flight in an aeroplane. This she did on Feb. 15, 1909, at Pau, France, when she made an
