ARRESTED A WOMAN

In Connection With Death of Week Old Infant

MRS. C. A. OBER, AGED 58

It is Alleged That the Infant Was Child of Mrs. Kate Donohue, Who is Mrs. Ober's Daughter, Hearing Not Set.

Rutland, May 27.—Mrs. C. A. Ober was arrested yesterday afternoon by Deputy Sheriff D. A. Barker on the charge of murder in having caused the death of the one-week-old baby girl, whose body was found in a hatbox near the Charles Griswold place east of Castleton last Monday. It is alleged that the child was the daughter of Mrs. Kate Donohue, who is the daughter of Mrs. Ober. No hearing will be held till report comes from the state laboratory at Burlington on the autopsy. Mrs. Ober is 58 years of age. The cover of the hatbox was tightly shut. Conductor Paul Fish of the local street railway company reports that a woman boarded his car out of Rutland at 9:40 Sunday night and that she carried a hatbox. The woman, he says, got off the car near the Griswold place in Castleton, and when he made the return trip the woman again got on the car at a point somewhat nearer Rutland. She carried no hatbox then, he said.

WEATHER MAN WILL BE INVESTIGATED

Committee of One Named to Look Into Official Conduct of Willis L. Moore.

Washington, May 27.—Representative Mess of Indiana, chairman of the committee on expenditures in the department of agriculture, has designated Representative Doughton, a member of the committee as a sub-committee of one to investigate the weather bureau with particular reference to the official conduct of Prof. Willis L. Moore, the bureau chief.

Mr. Doughton is directed to report to the full committee and if he decides that an exhaustive investigation of Mr. Moore's administration of the weather bureau is essential a sub-committee of three members will be appointed for the purpose.

It is admitted by members of the committee that many complaints concerning the weather bureau have been received and that a general investigation of that particular branch of the government service probably will be undertaken.

ROME'S IDEAL OF VIRTUE.

An Absolute Surrender of One's Own Personality to Family Interests.

Simplicity, loyalty, industry, an absolute surrender of one's own personality to the family and its interests—these, in the great families, were the traditional feminine virtues which lived again in Livia to the admiration of her contemporaries. But with these virtues were associated also the need and the pride of participating in the affairs and work of her husband, that interest in politics which had been common to the intelligent women of the nobility.

OLD SPANISH MINE MADE THEM RICH

O'Donoghue Brothers Returning From Bolivia to Ireland for a Holiday.

New York, May 27.—Among the passengers arriving Wednesday from South and Central America on the Royal Mail steam packet Orotava were Steven and Patrick O'Donoghue of Wexford, Ireland, who went out to Bolivia, South America six years ago to work in a tin mine and afterwards made a fortune in an old gold mine worked by the Spaniards 400 years ago. Patrick O'Donoghue is 24 years old, and his brother is nine years his senior.

"My brother and myself," said Mr. O'Donoghue, "were receiving \$5,000 a year each as employees in the tin mine in Bolivia, and saved out money with the object of speculating in one of the old mines which had been worked so many years ago by the Spaniards. "The mine we have now was worked 20 years ago by a Bolivian company, which failed, and the bank at La Paz held the property. Four other Irishmen working there put their money with ours, and we bought it for \$20,000.

"At the present time we have 1,000 Indians and half-breeds called Cholos working in the mine which is managed by 25 white men, all Irishmen, and have had an offer of \$400,000 from a Chilean company for the property, which we have declined."

Mr. O'Donoghue and his brother are going to Ireland to-day by the White Star liner Cedric for a holiday and will go back to Bolivia in the fall, which will be commencement of the summer down in their part of South America.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE, THE GOSPEL OF SALVATION

divine remedy for every discordant condition of human experience and when the master's teachings are understood, the one effectual remedy will be found available.

It is sometimes said that the immediate disciples of Christ were divinely favored persons, whose privilege it was to enjoy many blessings that Christians of the twentieth century may not enjoy. The failure to see the connection between the Master's teachings and the healing works accomplished by himself and his disciples, has limited man's possibilities and greatly retarded the progress of christianity.

The strong point urged by Christian Science is that the power to heal sickness and destroy sin which was exercised by the disciples, was the natural result of understanding what they had been taught. If they had not understood, at least in part, the Master's teachings and in some degree attained the spiritual consciousness of being, they could not have demonstrated the power of truth and love.

One of the essential elements of the Christian religion was early lost sight of and for centuries the healing of sickness through faith in God was considered no longer possible or necessary. To say that the healing works accomplished by Jesus and his disciples were only necessary to prove that the long promised Messiah had appeared among men in fulfillment of prophecy, is to present a view of the question which has no scriptural authority. Salvation, as Jesus taught and demonstrated it, is a present salvation from all that is unlike God.

It was the lack of spiritual perception which caused mortals to consider the very natural and proper thing to turn to drugs and other material remedies for healing. The almost universal experience has been that it is not until these material means have failed, or it was apparent that they would do so, that mortals have turned in their extremity to God. It was the failure of material remedies that led to the discovery of Christian Science.

"Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," is the only text-book on Christian Science. It was written by Mrs. Eddy and first published in 1875. In this book the author has presented in a clear, logical manner, the divine principle of Christian Science and the rules for the application thereof. It was never intended that this book should take the place of the Bible, and it has never been regarded by Christian Scientists as a substitute for the Bible in any sense of the word. It is, as its title indicates, the key to the scriptures. It unlocks this treasure house of divine wisdom and makes practical the teachings of the sacred word.

This Science teaches that God is the one infinite good and that which He creates could not be less than good, neither could it possibly have any inclination or tendency toward evil. God is Spirit, that which He creates is spiritual. The scriptural teaching is very definite that God created man in His own image and likeness. The mortal concept of man is no more correct than the mortal concept of God.

WANTED TO BE MENTAL NOT ACTUAL WIFE

School Teacher Thought Marriage Meant Only Perfected Friendship.—Husband Asks Separation.

New York, May 27.—Mrs. Harriet M. Gordon bride of a half-year, whose theory is that marriage should be a "strong spiritual friendship, nothing more," explained her views on marriage. Mrs. Gordon's husband, Jacob D. Gordon, a young lawyer, with offices in this city, recently instituted proceedings for a separation at Patsheogue L. I.

Since parting from her husband on the evening following their marriage, Nov. 9, 1910, Mrs. Gordon has been living under her maiden name in apartments in the neighborhood of Gramercy square. She continued teaching also under her maiden name in one of the largest public schools in Manhattan.

"In the first place let me say that I feel the same admiration, the same respect for my husband as on the day I married him. He is a man of the highest intellectual attainments, a man of whom any woman would be proud.

"All our trouble has been due simply to a misunderstanding. Although I am 27 years old and have lived the usual life of an American girl, I can now truthfully say that I did not fully understand all the duties of married life.

"To me marriage has always been an ideal state of perfected friendship, of flawless mental companionship.

"Of course I knew of what I might term the standard viewpoint of mat-

rimony, but only vaguely. Its real significance did not dawn upon me until after I had married the man whom I thought of as the perfect friend.

"Our mistake was in not discussing these phases of married life with absolute frankness before we were married. All couples should do this before they seek the marriage license bureau. No marriage should be performed when one of the parties thereto desires naught save companionship.

"I have come to think now that I knew not the difference between friendship and love. Some day perhaps mad, overwhelming love will come to me. Until then I shall remain in my sphere of lonely happiness.

"I would not have you think either, that I have neglected to consider the possible effect on society and the development of the race if all young women held such views as mine.
