ABOUT THE STATE

HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

Seven cases of smallpox have appeared in North Troy.

Mrs. Tamson Gray of Sutton was killed on the railroad at the summit May 31.

Rev. J. W. Burgin, pastor of the Baptist church of Newport Center, has accepted a call to the Baptist church at Sutton, and will begin work there July 1.

Mrs. J. L. Gates of Newfane will try an experiment this season by planting corn from an ear which was brought to her 29 years ago from Michigan, and which she has kept all these years as a keepsake.

Mrs. Charles A. Plumley of Northfield broke a small bone in one ankle and also put the ankle out of joint when, with her son, Fletcher, in her arms, she jumped from a carriage which was backing down a hill. She set the joint herself before medical aid arrived.

The number of Vermonters in camp with the regulars at Plattsburg barracks has now reached 100, including nearly every lieutenant and non-commissioned officer in the first Vermont Infantry, in addition to some selected privates. Strict military discipline is maintained and evening, morning and afternoon is given over to instruction.

Myron Ingalls was badly hurt in Windham Tuesday, when, in coming down a hill on his bicycle in the darkness, he ran headlong into a pair of horses being driven by Walter Holden. He was unconscious for some time and was evidently kicked in the face. Just how serious his injuries are is not yet decided, but he is in a bad condition.

John E. Keefe, aged 35 years, son of John V. Keefe of Bellows Falls, was killed on the Fitchburg division of the Boston & Maine railroad last week by being caught between two cars which he was trying to couple. He was conductor of a freight train running between Bellows Falls and Fitchburg, with headquarters at the latter place.

An Italian, known only as Frank, was considerably battered up Thursday in Hinsdale, N. H., on the Boston & Maine road, when a fellow countryman struck him over the head with a shovel. One ear was cut entirely in two, 24 stitches were required to sew up a cut on his face and 12 to close a wound in the back of his head. It is said that Frank demanded \$2 which he had loaned the other Italian and drew his revolver to emphasize the demand, whereupon his fellow-countryman hit him with the shovel. He is in the Brattleboro Memorial hospital.

ANOTHER OLD SOLDIER DEAD.

Asa B. Mack Died Tuesday at His Home in Cabot.

Asa B. Mack died at his home in Cabot Tuesday morning at the age of 85 years. He had been in poor health for several years. He enlisted in Co. G, 4th Vermont volunteers, and served in the Civil war. He was taken prisoner and was in Andersonville prison five months and nineteen days. When taken prisoner he weighed 200 pounds and when discharged weighed only 86 pounds. After the war he married Cora E. Kenerson of Cabot, who survives him. They lived most of the time in Cabot. They purchased the farm known now as Fair View, on the west side, and overlooking Lake St. Joseph, and lived there until about six years ago, when they sold the farm and later purchased a home in Cabot village, where they lived at the time of his death.

BRATTLEBORO PLUMBERS QUIT

Demand Same Pay with Less Work—One Employer Sells Out.

Brattleboro, June 9.—About 25 Brattleboro plumbers and helpers stopped work Saturday noon in accordance with resolutions which they passed at a meeting a few days ago when they all agreed to ask for a half holiday on Saturday with the same pay per week. They held a meeting on the common at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon and decided to remain out until their demands are granted. The master plumbers in town intimate that other men are asking for jobs. A. V. Cox, who has been in the plumbing business for 40 years, stated when the resolutions were first made public that no hired man would dictate to him and Saturday night at 3 o'clock he sold his business to one of his employees, Pearl T. Clapp.

SIX DROWN WHEN STEAMERS COLLIDE

Hamburg Fishing Steamer Run Into by British Steamer Adendale.

Cuxhaven, Germany, June 9.—The British steamer Adendale when putting out to sea yesterday collided with the Hamburg fishing steamer, Johann Heinrich, which was sunk.

Four of the fishing boat's crew were saved when life boats were put over the side, but six more, including the captain are missing and are believed to have been drowned.

No cause for the collision is known as yet, but it is thought to be due to a heavy fog hanging over the harbor.

BACHELORS WANT WIVES

Organize a Club of Members Who Are Willing to Marry.

Goodland, Kan., June 9.—Goodland has a bachelors' club; recently organized, but the bachelors do not intend to continue to lead lives of single blessedness if the right young women appear.

Robert Hyal, a jeweler and a prosperous young business man, is president of the organization, which is known as the Hurry-Up Bachelors' club; William Neu, proprietor of one of the leading hotels of Goodland, is secretary. Hugh Elliott, a young furniture dealer, is treasurer of the club.

The other members include George Johns, locomotive fireman and extra engineer; Lowell Shaw, assistant cashier of the National bank of Goodland; Col. W. Bradley, a well-to-do farmer and business man; Joe Reed and Hugh Hyal, a wealthy farmer and land owner.

It is stated on good authority that none of the members of the bachelors' club would object to matrimony, if suited.

SEVEN TRUE BILLS IN ORANGE COUNTY

Grand Jury Concluded Deliberations and Reported Friday—Long Session Ahead of County Court.

Chelsea, June 9.—The Orange county grand jury concluded their investigations and filed their report Friday afternoon, presenting seven true bills. The grand jury was in charge of Deputy Sheriff Maurice A. Gale of Bradford, assisted by Deputy Sheriff W. E. Worthley of Washington. State's Attorney Williams has filed a large number of informations and the outlook is that the term will last well into July unless the respondents should be inclined to enter pleas of guilty.

The June term convened Tuesday, June 3, with the following court officers present: Presiding judge, Eleazer L. Waterman of Brattleboro; assistant judges, Warren L. Crafts of Bradford and Henry R. Howard of Enbridge; clerk, Hale Darling of Chelsea; deputy clerk, William H. Sprague of Chelsea; sheriff, E. W. Kent of Randolph; state's attorney, Frank S. Williams of Bradford; reporter, Willis E. Monty of Burlington; high bailiff, William E. Worthley of Washington. Deputies Azro A. Reed of Williamstown and George A. Tracy of Chelsea are assisting Sheriff Kent at this term.

The 14 cases set for trial by jury and 18 set for trial by the court. The grand jurors were called, sworn and charged by the court, after which they took up their deliberations. Scott Fellows of Newbury having been appointed foreman.

Of the 14 cases set for trial by jury, five were continued, one settled and four were tried during the week, as follows: Town of West Fairlee vs. Wilbur Moore, which was an action based on the statute which makes a person liable to a fine for bringing a pauper from one town into another town with the intent to make such town liable for the support of such pauper. This case only occupied the attention of the court during one day and the jury rendered a verdict for the defendant, Benjamin Tucker, 700 miles; place is a man nearly 80 years old, to recover his costs. E. W. Smith of Wells River was the attorney for the town and David S. Conant of Bradford and R. M. Harvey of Montpelier were attorneys for the defendant.

The next case taken up was entitled W. R. Halsey vs. H. B. Hordford, which was an action in assumpsit in which the plaintiff sued to recover for services in designing and drawing the plans and specifications for a barn which the defendant was to build. The plaintiff sought to recover the sum of \$200, but the jury found for him to recover the sum of \$100 and his costs. Of this jury, George K. Sprague of Brookfield was the foreman. S. C. Wilson of Chelsea was the attorney for the plaintiff and David S. Conant of Bradford for the defendant.

It is expected that there will be six more cases tried by jury before the criminal docket is taken up.

Orange County Bar Association.

On the evening of the opening day of court, the Orange County Bar association held its annual meeting, when the following officers were elected: President, N. L. Boyden; vice-president, E. W. Smith of Wells River; secretary-treasurer, Hale K. Darling of Chelsea; executive committee, John C. Sherburne of Randolph and Stanley C. Wilson of Chelsea. Stanley C. Wilson was appointed committee on jurisprudence and law reform, and William H. Sprague was appointed committee on legal history and biography.

After the election of officers, the president gave a very interesting address on the following theme, "The Attitude Which Should Be Taken by Lawyers with Regard to New Legislation," after which there was a discussion by the members of the bar on the subject of the new tax law. Hon. George L. Stow was appointed at this meeting to prepare a sketch on the life of the late William H. Nichols of Randolph, to be presented at a special meeting of the Orange County Bar association, which will be held during the December term of court.
