

MAKES DEAD HEART BEAT

The Discovery Is Reported by a French Physician

SPECIAL LIQUID USED FOR EXPERIMENTS

This Is to Be Kept a Secret for the Time Being

Paris, July 9.—Before the Academy of Sciences, Dr. Bouchon read a paper describing experiments with a liquid with which he was able to restore the beatings of the human heart, after it had been removed from the body. The academy will investigate the facts related by Dr. Bouchon, who declares that in the meantime he wishes to keep the composition of the liquid a secret.

HOME RULE'S SECOND PASSAGE.

Majority of reg in British Commons Sends Bill Up to House of Lords.

London, July 9.—In the House of Commons Monday night, the motion of Andrew Bonar Law, the opposition leader, to reject the Irish home rule bill was defeated by a vote of 352 to 243. The bill then passed its third reading without a division. This marks the second step toward the ultimate establishment of home rule under the new Parliament act limiting the veto powers of the House of Lords. Assuming, as is expected, that the Lords will reject the bill again, the measure must be passed a third time by the Commons not less than two years after its original introduction. The two-year period on the Irish home rule bill expires next May. The Commons may then pass the bill a third time and it will go to the king for approval without reference to the opinion of the House of Lords.

TWO MEN ROBBED LAUGH WITH JOY

Highwaymen Get \$10,000 in Stage Money—Miss \$110 in the Wagon Seat.

New York, July 9.—With their pockets bulging with yellowbacks, Benjamin Goldberg and Julius Verban, partners in the produce business, left Passaic, N. J., at an early hour for Newark to purchase butter, eggs and vegetables. They were driving in a one-horse wagon along River road, when two masked highwaymen jumped out from the shadow of a tree and displayed revolvers.

One of the highwaymen kept the produce merchants "covered," while the other climbed into the wagon and searched them. Verban, a six-footer, showed fight, but the masked man landed an uppercut on his chin and he tumbled backward into the wagon. Goldberg offered no protest when the highwaymen took a roll of bills from his pockets.

When the two men had stopped the wagon, Verban yelled for help, but before a policeman came running the two robbers had disappeared into the woods. The policeman found Goldberg and Verban embracing each other and shedding tears of joy.

"Two masked men have just robbed us," said Goldberg to the policeman.

Puzzled by the laughter of the two, the policeman remarked:

"Well, you seem to be carrying on over the matter as though it were a huge joke."

"And sure it is," explained Verban.

"Them two guys are running their fool legs off through that briar patch, and all they have got is \$10,000 in—"

"What, \$10,000?" shouted the policeman.

"Sure," said Goldberg, "but it's stage money and they don't know it."

Goldberg then displayed \$110 in real money, which had been hidden under the cushion of the wagon seat. While making a trip to Newark a year ago, Goldberg and Verban were robbed of \$150 by highwaymen. Since then they have carried the stage money, anticipating a second hold-up.

TOSSED COIN TO CHOOSE "SLEEPING DUEL" VICTIM

The Winner Slashed the Throat of His Rival as He Slumbered.

Mobile, Ala., July 9.—In a "sleeping duel," Charles Robinson's throat was cut and he is dying in a hospital. Robinson and Frank Broncho, a Spaniard, shipped on the schooner Henry Crosby for the West Indies. They loved the same girl.

Two days out, according to Broncho, they matched pennies to see which should cut the other's throat while he slept. Robinson lost. He is too weak to give his version, and the whole truth may never be known. The schooner's captain returned to port with the wounded man.


