HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

A severe hail storm in Vernon and South Vernon did considerable damage to the tobacco crop. The house of Jacob Allen in Vernon was also struck by lightning but the inmates were not injured.

T. S. Wheeler, a Plainfield, N. J. automobile, was fined \$1 in Burlington city court last Saturday for not stopping when so requested by an officer.

The Army and Navy Journal for August 2 in mentioning the promotion to rear admiral of Captain Henry T. Mayo of the well known Mayo family of Burlington, speaks of his long and honorable career in the United States service. Since April Rear Admiral Mayo has been in aid for personnel in the navy department.

During July, Assistant City Judge J. Dyer Spellman of Rutland took \$380.16 in fines and costs.
