### HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

A Bristol man is authority for the statement that forty years ago yesterday, Dec. 3, the snow was two feet deep on a level.

James Hartness of Springfield was elected president of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, which is in annual session in New York City.

The annual meeting of the New England Fat Men's club will be held at Waits River Friday evening, December 19. The business meeting will be held at the village hall, followed by the banquet at Hall's tavern, where the club was organized nine years ago. Smith S. Ballard of Montpelier is now president of this famous organization, which boasts of a membership of more than 5,000.

George S. Eastman of Essex Junction died Saturday after an illness of three weeks with acute Bright's disease. He was 69 years old the day he died. Mr. Eastman was born in Monkton. He was in business in Boston for some years during his early manhood, but had resided in Essex for about 19 years. He was a 32nd degree Mason and a former member of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery of Boston. He is survived by his wife and one daughter.

Someone entered the Brusa Granite Co. sheds in Northfield, Monday morning, sometime between four o'clock and seven and defaced two stones which were ready for shipment. On one stone the cap was ruined and the other the die was broken and spoiled. The offender was someone who was evidently familiar with the premises, as everything pointed to apparent knowledge of the sheds. Mrs. Ada E. Lashua, wife of Fred Lashua of Richmond, who was shot in Whitehall, N. Y., by Fred C. Turill of Swanton, who afterward killed himself, told something of her past history when she reached Vermont, Monday on her way home. She asserted she left her husband in May, 1913, because of his abuse and went away with Turill because he told her if she did so she should never want for anything. In Concord, N. Y., she kept house for him, but was never represented as his wife. Tired of this, she started for home, but when she reached Vermont, changed her mind and decided to go to Whitehall, N. Y., and get a position in the silk mill. Turill followed her and while she was talking with an old acquaintance, began shooting, which is the last she remembers. She is 19 years old and of attractive appearance, though now she has a black eye and wears a bandage about her head to cover the two bullet wounds which Turill's shot inflicted.

Dr. William H. Fitzgerald, a native of Middlebury who graduated from the medical department of the U. V. M. in 1885, is credited with being the discoverer of a method of producing local anaesthesia without the use of drugs, by pressure on the nerves of the neck. Dr. Fitzgerald has made extensive study of these nerves and at a recent clinic of 24 prominent physicians at a New York hospital, demonstrated his plan, several operations being performed in their presence where the patients, though fully conscious, felt no pain. The doctor, who is regarded in New York state as a leading specialist in diseases of the nose and throat, has apparently made a discovery which will revolutionize the custom of the Anesthetist. Among the demonstrations were the anaesthetizing of a woman's hand so that pins were thrust into the flesh in various places without her feeling it; in another case it was a foot which was anaesthetized, fifteen incisions being made without pain; two teeth were painlessly extracted and an ear was removed without sensation, the latter being considered one of the most painful of operations.
