Although it is a week after Thanksgiving, people of Vermont may well express their thanks that only one person was the victim of a hunter's gun during the Vermont open season. That is presumed to be the case, although there seems to be considerable doubt about the killing of a man named Wait in the town of Peru. Report had it at the time of the killing that the man was the victim of a chance shot, and there the matter seems to have rested, at least so far as the general public has been allowed to know. In the absence of more definite and conclusive evidence, it may be taken to be a fact that this man Wait was shot by a hunter, rather than that he was the victim of a homicide. At any rate, his was the only death during the open season for deer, which could be in any way attributed to hunting carelessness, which makes a surprisingly small proportion to the total numbers of hunters in the woods. There is real reason for congratulation over that state of affairs.

THE MEXICAN QUESTION MARK.

It is all but impossible to arrive at accurate conclusions concerning the true state of affairs in the so-called republic of Mexico, the dispatches apparently being fashioned to suit the desires of the controlling faction or being influenced by the sympathies of the sender. From the federal side come the reports of the continued war-like activities of the Huerta administration, while from the rebel, or constitutionalist, side come equally positive representations of continued crumbling of the reigning power and the establishment more and more of the opponents of Huerta. Then, over and above these perplexities, there arises the suspicion that all is not just peace and harmony among the various rebel leaders, who are encompassing General Huerta; one is led to suspect that more than one man is ambitious to be the premier figure among those who are attacking the government that seems to be at the present time. Moreover, if Huerta is forced out, it is not at all certain that the ambitious warriors will settle down peacefully and permit the control to pass into the hands of a single successor to Huerta. When the present war is settled there is no assurance that there will not be another just as soon as an energetic soldier can gather an army about him. But whatever may be those developments, it does appear likely that Huerta will be forced to abdicate and seek protection of his own life in some other section of the universe than that immediately connected with Mexico. Signs of decay of his power in the northern part of the country are augmented by the lapses into excesses of which he is accused at the present time; no man pretending to wield dictatorial powers can hope to continue that domination unless he keeps a sharp check on himself. President Wilson's quiet confidence that if he allowed Huerta rope enough he would hang himself, figuratively speaking, seems about to be justified.
