HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

The village of Jeffersonville voted \$1,700 at a recent village meeting for a village water system.

Twenty-three deaths occurred in Rutland during March, none of them being caused by a contagious disease.

The infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Ransom of Jericho Center was badly scalded about the feet and legs Saturday evening when it pulled a coffee pot full of coffee onto itself, while at the supper table.

W. B. Plunket of Adams, Mass., is to establish an electric power plant to light his summer home in Heartwellville, and it is understood that the capacity will be sufficient for the use of the village in case it sees fit to avail itself of it, as it probably will.

Horace Day, a Morrisville man, has been suffering for some time from what appeared to be an ingrowing toe nail, but when gangrene began to set in he was hurried to the Fanny Allen hospital at Winooski, where it was found the nail had grown to the bone.

There are at present 147 prisoners at the house of correction and the Rutland county jail. The number has varied little for some months, the enrollment of inmates ranging from 145 to 155.

Charles M. Keyes, for many years one of Springfield's prosperous merchants and furriers, died at his home Tuesday, Mr. Keyes had been in poor health for some time and suffered a shock of paralysis about a week ago.

Good Lumber Scarce in Rutland County. There were fewer logs, in the state in which they are taken out of the woods, brought into Rutland the past winter than for many years, with the possible exception of the winter of 1912-13, when an almost total absence of snow brought lumber operations to a standstill.

At this season of the year the large yard of the Rutland Manufacturing company is usually filled with rough logs, piled high, but although the concern has covered about 600,000 feet of logs the past season for customers the material purchased for their own use has nearly all been sawed before delivery.

ARRESTED IN ITALY. Two Suspects in Murder of Henry Ward at New Haven.

Vergennes, April 2.—Two Italians were arrested in Italy Tuesday who are believed to have murdered and robbed Henry Ward, a well known resident of New Haven, on the night of Dec. 12, 1912.

Rutland, April 2.—A divorce case of more than usual interest was heard in Rutland county court yesterday afternoon. Freeman E. Baird, who is 81 years old, asking for a bill of separation from his wife, Catherine Sears Baird, age 39 years, to whom he was married in 1901.

A divorce was granted to Anna Brophy of this city from Martin Brophy on the ground of willful desertion.

In the case of George E. Lawrence vs. A. W. Goddard, set for trial yesterday, the defendant consented to the entry of a judgment for the plaintiff unless the case is settled within a week.

The marriage last year of Luigia Ciolfi, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Ciolfi of Howe street, and Pasquale Cappabianca, also of Rutland, was annulled by Judge W. W. Miles. The young wife and her parents petitioned that the marriage be annulled, the action being brought through C. V. Poulin.


