A mass meeting of graduate nurses of Vermont is to be held in Burlington May 12, at 4 p. m., for the purpose of forming a Vermont Association of Nurses. Miss Sophie F. Palmer, editor-in-chief of the American Journal of Nursing, is to address the meeting. Nearly all states are forming an association, so it is hoped there will be a large attendance at this time.

C. F. Smith, auctioneer, was in Worcester yesterday selling a Jersey herd for Frank T. Hutchinson. A fair crowd was in attendance, and good prices were realized, but not as high as at some previous sales or where Holstein or Ayrshires were in evidence. Cows sold for from \$30 to \$65 per head, two-year old heifers from \$35 to \$45 and a bunch of yearlings brought \$25 each. This winter's calves sold for from \$10 to \$13 each. The extremely low price of butter is beginning to be felt in the price of milk cows.

One of the Barre boys who is likely to see service in Mexico if the present hostilities are to continue is William Webster, for several years a member of the regular army corps, who is now stationed at Honolulu. Recently the war department has issued comprehensive orders for the fortification of the harbor at Honolulu with the ultimate view of making that point one of the strategic naval bases on the Pacific. A large garrison now stationed in the Hawaiian islands will probably be ordered to the border of Mexico and among the detachments likely to be pressed into active service is the company to which Mr. Webster belongs. According to intelligence received here, upon the fortifications is to go on apace, although the military strength in the islands will be temporarily reduced in all probability.
