WAR SECRETARY INTERESTED.

Writes President Spooner He Hopes Norwich May Not Suffer in Usefulness.

In a recent letter to President Spooner of Norwich university, the secretary of war says:

"I am taking this occasion to express to you the hope that nothing may occur to prejudice the great usefulness of your institution. As to the value of military training, particularly in an institution devoted largely to engineering, I cannot do better than to quote the following remarks by Dean Orton of the Ohio State university:

"The old adage that 'no one can properly control others who cannot first control himself' is one of those eternal verities which cannot be too often driven into the minds of the young college men. Any young engineer looks forward to controlling others. In a sense every young college man does, whether he is an engineer or not, but in law and medicine and agriculture, the future director control of a force of men does not loom up on the horizon as it does to one who expects to play a leading part in the railroad, mine or factory. But how shall we get this power of leadership? How shall we learn to impose our will upon others and still keep their respect and regard?
