HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

Daniel St. John of East Charlotte has killed 17 foxes since the hunting season opened last fall, also a number of racoons and skunks.

Five sheep belonging to Mr. McGrail of Montpelier recently presented him 11 lambs, there being four sets of twins and one set of triplets.

The pupils of Newport high school have earned and contributed nearly \$100 towards the purchase of a victrola and records used in the school.

Walter Hollister of Bennington, the 16-year-old who was made totally blind when a charge of peas was fired at him, has been admitted to the Austine institution as a student.

Rev. A. V. Woodworth, pastor of the Congregational church at Harwinton, Conn., has accepted a call to the West Brattleboro Congregational church. Before going to Harwinton he was engaged in missionary work in the South.

Guy M. Page, secretary of the Vermont Senate during the last two sessions, who has been ill for the past two months at his home in Burlington, is recovering. His illness has been diagnosed as typhoid fever.

The birth of four boys within two days in a small village like Townshend is rather an unusual circumstance, and the fact that two of them were born upon Lincoln's birthday anniversary added to the interest.

Mrs. Clarissa Joy, aged 93 years, widow of Benjamin Joy, who died at the home of her son, Alpheus B. Joy, in Underhill center, late Tuesday night, was born in Fairfield July 5, 1823. In her girlhood days she often assisted in caring for the late President Chester A. Arthur, when he was a baby, and whose parents were her neighbors.

Mrs. Sherman R. Moulton of Burlington received injuries to one ankle on Wednesday evening, the result of an accident to a hack in which she was being taken to the station. One of the wheels of the hack broke and the horse ran away. Mrs. Moulton, in an attempt to save herself, jumped from the sleigh and when she was picked up it was found had perhaps broken ankle.

Barbara, two-year-old daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Harry H. Lawrence of Putney, died Feb. 15 after an illness of over a month with a most peculiar disease. For three weeks previous to her death the child had been unconscious. Acid poisoning of some nature, similar to the cases of acidosis which occurred in Boston recently, seemed to be the cause of her illness. The physicians were unable to find any remedy for the disease.

A Bennington mill several years ago ordered a large shipment of dye from abroad and on its arrival it was found to be black, instead of the color ordered. After some controversy, the Bennington firm kept the barrel, putting it in storage, where it had ever since remained. Within a month, a traveling representative of a dye concern, visiting Bennington, learned of the barrel in storage and purchased it. The Bennington firm paid at the rate of \$33 per 100 pounds for what the barrel contained, when times were normal, but the wholesale dye-house which just purchased it paid at the rate of \$600 per 100 pounds.

HEARING ON LABEL GUARANTEES.

Postponement of Food Inspection Decision Again Sought.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 19.—A hearing on the question of postponement of the effective date of food inspection decision 193, which in substance forbids the use of guaranty legends and serial numbers on labels of foods and drugs in interstate commerce, will be held in the bureau of chemistry, 216 13th street, S. W., Washington, D. C., at 2 o'clock p. m., March 19, 1916.

This decision, issued May 5, 1914, as originally promulgated, was to take effect May 1, 1915. Later, the date on which it was to take effect was postponed until May 1, 1916, with the proviso as to products packed and labeled prior to May 1, 1916, in accordance with law and with the regulations in effect prior to May 5, 1914, that the effective date was postponed until November 1, 1916.

Numerous requests recently have been made to the department for further postponement. Those requesting this action represent that manufacturers and dealers still have on hand large quantities of labels printed prior to May 5, 1914, and bearing the guaranty legend and serial number. It is represented that this supply of labels in the aggregate cost many thousands of dollars, and that unless they can be used their owners will sustain a severe loss.

On the other hand, many manufacturers, in expectation of the new regulation's going into operation next May, have already eliminated the guaranty legend and serial number from their labels.

All parties interested in the question, whether in favor of the extension or opposed to it, are invited to attend the hearing and present such facts as may be material. Those unable to attend in person may submit their own views in writing. Communication should be addressed to the chief of the bureau of chemistry, U. S. department of agriculture, Washington, D. C.

Local Option League Replies to Gov. Gates.

Judge James M. Tyler of Brattleboro, president of the Vermont Local Option league, has issued a statement to the public in which he states the position of the league as set forth in the book, let, recently published and distributed to the voters of the state.

Judge Tyler's statement is as follows: "Gov. Gates' statement having been called to the attention of leading officers of the Local Option league they expressed great surprise at the construction that his excellency placed upon the paragraphs referred to in the local option document."

"The governor signed the proposed prohibitory law passed by the legislature at its last session, and it is generally understood that it had his personal approval. It never occurred to the officers of the Local Option league that the governor was with them; they knew he was on the other side.

"The 'document' on page 13, calls the attention of voters to the subject of the town unit and to the growing danger of centralized power in government, and on this vital subject quotes, verbatim, paragraphs from the governor's inaugural message in which he speaks in strong terms of the danger of having 'our people relieved of the actual responsibility of citizenship.'

"Then, that no one may be misled, the 'document' says that the governor's success as highway commissioner was largely due to his adherence to the town unit system, and quotes another paragraph from the message in which he applies his sound doctrine to the subject of highways.

"The league would apply this doctrine to the question to be settled at the March meeting."
