HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

Rev. E. P. Lovett, a retired Baptist minister, died at his home in Brandon March 8. He was 80 years old.

Alonso A. Martin, who represented Hartland in the legislature of 1910, died in that place March 6 from blood poisoning, which resulted from a carbuncle. He was a Mason and prominent in town affairs. He was 73 years of age.

As Albert Kinney was returning to Greensboro Tuesday afternoon, accompanied by his 22-month-old son, the sleigh tipped over in going through a cradle hole, throwing out the doctor and frightening the horse, which started into a run. The doctor secured another team and hurried after the runaway, which was found stuck in a snowdrift into which it had plunged, and the child was still in the sleigh, unhurt.

The Staso Milling company is to transfer its Poulton branch to Hampton, N. Y., where a new plant has been erected. TEACHERS' CONFERENCE HELD.

There Was Large Representation at Burlington, March 11.—The teachers' conference at Billings library yesterday was attended by a large representation from secondary schools throughout Vermont. It was the 11th meeting of public school instructors with the University of Vermont, each of which has resulted in practical good to those who attended.

The topic for yesterday's gathering was "Problems in Secondary Education." Discussion was opened by Augustus S. Downing, commissioner of education of New York, who took the reorganization feature, showing how necessary it was for cooperation and for a definite and comprehensive system of supervision and control.

The problem of administration was taken up by F. W. Wallace of Enosburg Falls, and R. G. Reynolds of the state department of education considered college entrants. Mr. Reynolds represented the Schoolmasters' club. Principal Ralph A. Eaton of Northfield, of the Headmasters' club and Miss Margaret Tilley of Essex, of the Woman Teachers' club, also spoke on the question from their viewpoint.

Non resident teachers were served luncheon at 12:30 as guests of the university, the affair being in charge of the domestic science department.

In the afternoon Prof. James L. McCaughy of Dartmouth college, President Ira L. Reeves of Norwich university, Dean E. J. Wiley of Middlebury college and Prof. M. W. Andrews of the University of Vermont, participated in a general discussion; "The Problem of Military Training."
