Glennorris Is Said to Have Aided in Interment of Dorothy Arnold

CONVICT IN R. I. PRISON 'CONFESSES'

Helped a "Wealthy Young Man" Dispose of Body—Latest Story Doubted

Providence, R. I., April 18.—Detectives are investigating the story told by Edward C. Glennorris, an inmate of the Rhode Island state prison...

Glennorris told his story two weeks ago to Warden A. J. Davis of the state prison at Cranston...

While Glennorris tells a circumstantial story, the authorities do not profess to place much credence in what he says.

According to the prisoners a few months before the Arnold family in New York asked the police aid in the search for the missing girl...

"One night soon after," he says, "we went to New Rochelle by auto and stopped at a house. The young man who hired me went into the house and pretty soon came out carrying a woman in his arms."

"The next night the same auto called for us at the saloon and the young man, who I understand was wealthy, went with us again to the house near West Point."

"From pictures in the newspapers that I saw afterward I knew that the body was that of Dorothy Arnold. I sat beside her on the trip to West Point, and the jewelry that she wore was exactly like the description that the newspapers gave Miss Arnold's jewelry later on."

"I got \$250 from the young man for going along. He told me she died from an operation."

MOB SHOOT JOHN DYKES AT VERNON, FLA.

The Alleged Murderer First White Man Lynched in West Florida.

Pensacola, Fla., April 18.—Getting the drop on the deputies, a masked mob of 20 men took John Dykes of Greenfield from the Washington county jail at Vernon yesterday morning and shot him to death.

Dykes was charged with assassinating S. A. Walker, a turpentine operator and prominent citizen of Washington county. Dykes was the first white man ever lynched in West Florida.
