AMUSEMENT NOTES.

"Everywoman," the Work of Five Men.

To five men is the amusement world indebted for the production of "Everywoman," the peculiar dramatic spectacle, which Henry W. Savage will disclose at the opera house Tuesday, Sept. 19, through several hundred others labored long and earnestly in its behalf, each contributing his several portion. First of all, of course, the author, Walter Browne. He was a New York newspaper man, a soldier of fortune who had looked upon the seamy side of life in many lands and under diverse circumstances. "Everywoman" was his life's work. Upon it he expended the full fruit of his wide experience as an actor, a singer, a sailor, an editor, a lecturer, a traveler and an educator. He died in dire poverty on the morning of the day of the first performance of his play, Henry W. Savage was the producer. But for Mr. Savage's keen dramatic instinct it is doubtful whether poor Browne would ever have found a manager brave enough to invest sixty thousand dollars which was required to read the manuscript and had handed it back, but Mr. Savage scented its value and spared no money to make the production lavish. George Marion was the stage director. Those who witness the fourth act scene with the roistering crowds on Broadway, New York, at midnight on New Year's eve, will marvel at the accomplishment. It is a triumph of stagecraft. Walter Burridge painted the scenery. Audiences are amazed at the fidelity with which Mr. Burridge has transferred to canvas the familiar things of life. Whether the stage of "Everywoman" in Belgravia, or Broadway, New York, with its mellow lights, his brush has wrought a wizardry not easily forgotten. Last of the quintette responsible for "Everywoman" is Hy Mayer, the famous cartoonist and magazine illustrator, who designed the striking costumes worn by the thirty-seven speaking and singing characters of the play. His was a difficult task as the period of the action and the whimsicality of the idea required absolute originality.—adv.
