Up to date Germany has refused to enter into negotiations with the United States of Bryan.

The big rush of Austrians and Germans in the United States to take out naturalization papers as American citizens speaks louder than words what they think about the prospects of war.

We read that some boys were "playing" with a loaded rifle in a town in the northern part of the state. Now one of the boys is in a hospital with a bullet wound through the body. Strange coincidence, isn't it?

The Germans of Wisconsin probably would not have thought any the worse of Senator LaFollette had the senator from that state voted to uphold President Wilson's course in severing relations with Germany.


Not because they think the Brattleboro retreat is a place where patients are maltreated but because they think the place should be given a clean bill of health, the people of Vermont want an investigation of sensational accusations.

The kaiser's mailed fist is a powerful factor among the countries located near Germany, evidence of which is furnished by the failure of those countries to follow the lead of the United States and break off relations with Germany.

There are growing indications that it will pay American farmers to put in an unusual amount of seed during the coming spring. If the United States does not need the crops, Europe will be clamorous for them. By the time the crops are ripe it will be known whether there is to be a free ocean course to the market.

**SUPPORTING THEIR GOVERNMENT.**

Without a doubt a great deal of the assurance felt by the German government in the threatened declaration of war between the imperial government and that of the United States is due to the belief in Germany that a vast majority of the people of German descent in the United States would remain loyal to the kaiser's government and would either refuse to serve under the Stars and Stripes or would be useful agents for embarrassing the government in which they had their abiding-place. There are many millions of people of German descent now residing in the United States; indeed, they form no inconsiderable proportion of the entire population of the country. Were they to renounce their sympathy and allegiance with the government which has given them its protection for so many years, they might cause great uneasiness to the United States even though they should not commit any grave offenses against the government. Happily, however, the earliest manifestations show no bent of mind in that direction on the part of the German-American people of the United States. As a matter of fact, the expressed predilections have been in the line of cordial support of the United States government even after the severing of relations between the two countries. The German-American National Alliance, for instance, has through its delegates in convention assembled in Philadelphia taken formal action in voting the support of the great organization to the Washington government even to the point of bearing arms against the nation which gave them birth or which gave their parents birth. The German-American National Alliance is reported to represent three millions of German people in more than a score of states of the country and thus it is one of the largest, if not the largest, organizations having a German membership. Its action is likely to disabuse the minds of any persons in Germany who may have had the notion that an internal dissension would arise in the United States in the event of the outbreak of war between that country and Germany. The German people or those of German descent in the United States are thus proving their loyalty to the government which has given them such excellent opportunities. With few exceptions they are proving themselves as good Americans as the rest of us.


