

### PLOT CAUSED EXPLOSION

Bomb Responsible for the Tragedy at Eddy-stone, Penn.

IT WAS NOT ACCIDENTAL

Four Investigations by Officials in Progress—An Attempt to Wreck Bridge

That Teuton bomb plotters were responsible for the explosions which caused probably 153 deaths among women and girl operatives in the munitions plant of the Eddystone Manufacturing corporation at North Eddystone, Pa., is the general belief of investigating officials. In addition to the loss of life nearly 200 more of the employees in the shrapnel-filled room of the factory were injured, scores of them being maimed or mutilated—another object lesson in ruthlessness. Conditions about the plant, which was modern in every particular, were such as to have precluded almost the possibility of the minor explosions which started the wreck. Four investigations, by city, state, federal authorities, and by company officials, are in progress to determine the cause of the explosions. Detectives believe that, if it was incendiary, the perpetrator lost his life, or else made use of a time-clock appliance to set off a bomb. In addition to the two grain elevators destroyed at Minneapolis, by the incendiary's bomb, three others were set on fire and damaged slightly. Cleveland has reported a \$100,000 incendiary fire. An attempt to destroy an Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe railroad bridge in Kansas was frustrated by county officers who captured four of six armed men whom they found under the bridge. The prisoners were found to have a quantity of nitro-glycerine. A clergyman in Pittsburgh, who advocated a revolution against conscription, has been placed under arrest and is held under ten thousand dollar bonds.
