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CABOT MAN ONE HUNDRED YESTERDAY

Eben Wheeler, Who Celebrated Birthday, Is Hale, Hearty and Happy.

South Cabot, Aug. 23.—Yesterday at the home of his son, Wilbur B. Wheeler, in this village, Eben Wheeler celebrated his 100th birthday. A life-long Vermont, he is active and well and bids fair to rival in length of years the venerable Isaac Aldrich of Burke, now in his 104th year.

Eben Wheeler was born in Woodbury, August 22, 1817. He was next to the oldest in a family of nine children. Born and brought up in a wild, rocky and mountainous wilderness where there were scarcely any roads or schools, he had few advantages in his young life for a school education.

His father, one of the early pioneers of the forest, carried on the cooper business, making barrels for the transportation of potash, and young Eben early learned the cooper's trade, working with his father. His occupation since has been chiefly that of a cooper. He has always been very temperate in his habits, never addicted to the use of liquor or tobacco in any form.

Mr. Wheeler married late in life and was the father of three children, two daughters, now deceased, and one son, Wilbur B. with whom he lives. He has no grandchildren. The centenarian has always enjoyed unusually good health and does to-day. He is able to travel about and is anxious for something to do. His appetite is good and he eats whatever he wishes, not being troubled by the lack of teeth, as he has all his natural teeth but two, can see to shave a hoop or make a basket without the use of glasses and but for the loss of hearing retains all his faculties to a remarkable degree.
