HAPPENINGS OF INTEREST FROM DIFFERENT SECTIONS

P. R. Harrington of Benson caught a catfish in Lake Champlain at Benson Landing, weighing 17 1/2 pounds.

Michael Conway, a decorator at the high school building in Proctor, fell from a ladder one day last week and broke several ribs. He had to be taken to the Proctor hospital for treatment.

Elywn Farnum, principal of the Wallingford high school, is ill with scarlet fever. The schools have been closed, also churches, moving pictures and all gatherings where children would be present.

A barn at the home of Mrs. Harriet Tuttle in St. Albans was burned Saturday, with 30 bushels of onions and her winter supply of potatoes, also some furniture stored there, as well as hay and farming tools. The cause of the fire is unknown.

James R. Steen, a veteran of the Civil war, died at his home in Morrisville Oct. 5. For five years he had been totally blind. He enlisted in Co. H, 9th Vt. Vols., June 25, 1862, when 17 years of age, and was honorably discharged a year later by reason of having lost one eye by smallpox.

John J. O'Neil, aged 15 years, and Charles Naucedo, aged 14, have been taken from Rutland to the industrial school for the remainder of their minority for stealing grapes. Both were convicted of stealing strawberries in the summer of 1916 and since then had been on probation. Saturday they were caught stealing grapes from the L. C. Lovell farm.

Mrs. E. F. Blodgett, for 22 years a resident of West Brattleboro, was instantly killed Sunday by an automobile in front of the home of her son, Harold Blodgett, in Charlemont, Mass., where she was visiting. The driver of the car was a Mr. Clifford of Greenfield, Mass., and he said the woman stepped directly in front of the car, probably without noticing it. She was thrown some distance and her neck was broken.
