THREE NEW ENGLAND MEN DIED OF WOUNDS

Six More Died of Disease—There Were No VermonTERS in List

MUST HAVE DEALINGS WITH CZECHO-SLOVAKS

Czech-Slovaks, as Well as the Jugoslavs in Austria, Will Have Nothing to Do with Austrian Government.

The Vienna correspondent of the Frankfurt Gazette was quoted Wednesday by that newspaper as saying Austria is not disposed to enter into negotiations with the Czech-Slovak organization at Paris, but would deal only with those in Austria.

CORNMEAL STANDARDS. Hearing on the Matter to Be Held at Washington, Dec. 3.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 25.—A public hearing to consider the advisability of adopting definitions and standards for cornmeal and corn flour will be held by the joint committee on definition and standards at 10 a. m. Dec. 3 at the bureau of chemistry, United States department of agriculture, Washington, D. C.

Products made from both whole corn and degenerated corn will be considered. The committee desires information concerning sterilization and other means of insuring sound product under market conditions, and suggestions are desired on the rules that should be used in differentiating between sound and spoiled cornmeal and corn flour.

All persons interested are invited to attend and present pertinent facts. Those who desire may present their views in writing on or before the date of the hearing to the secretary of the committee, bureau of chemistry, Washington, D. C. The hearing will be held at 216, 13th street S. W., Washington, D. C.

The joint committee on definitions and standards is composed of representatives of the United States department of agriculture, the Association of American Dairy, Food and Drug Officials and the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists.

68 LIVES SACRIFICED FOR MOSES URITZKY



GERMAN MILITARY POLICY CRITICIZED

Members of German Reichstag Indulged in Sharp Statements, According to German Newspapers.

New York, Oct. 25.—German newspapers received here show that sharp criticism of the German military policy was voiced in debate during a sitting of the main committee of the Reichstag late in September. Deputy Adolph Groeber of the Centre party, Philipp Scheidemann, the Socialist leader and now secretary of state without portfolio in Prince Maximilian's government, Deputy Fischbeck of the People's Progressive party, and Dr. Gustav Straemann of the National Liberal party were the chief critics.

The keynote of their remarks was that the military policy reduced the civil government to the role of a puppet. According to the Vorwaerts of Sept. 29, the address of Herr Groeber was the greatest surprise of the day. In the past he has been a strong supporter of the militarist forces. During the debate he turned upon Chancellor Von Hertling and also General Von Stein, Prussian war minister, accusing the latter of having forbidden meetings in favor of the peace resolution passed by the Reichstag in July, 1917.



VOTE OF CONFIDENCE IN MAXIMILIAN

Vote Stood 193 to 52, with 23 Members Not Voting, According to Berlin Dispatches Received in Copenhagen.

Copenhagen, Oct. 25.—The German Reichstag has given Prince Maximilian, the imperial chancellor, a vote of confidence, the ballot standing 193 to 52, according to Berlin dispatches received here. Twenty-three of the members did not vote.

South to Raise More Broom-Corn. Replies to an inquiry in reference to broom-corn production recently sent out by the states relations service of the department of agriculture have been very encouraging. Florida, Mississippi, Tennessee, Louisiana, Alabama—in fact, the majority of the southern states—give promise of decided future activity in the raising of this crop, which, at the present excessively high price of brooms, is quite remunerative. In November, at the conference of representatives from the various boys' and girls' clubs of the south, in Washington, increased cultivation will be emphasized and encouraged. At this meeting also it is planned to have a boy broom maker from a nearby state demonstrate the simplicity of

home broom making and give actual figures on the low cost of turning out the finished product.
