Happenings of Interest from Different Sections.

A grange is to be organized at Danby Four Corners to-night.

Nine cases of influenza and four of mumps were reported to the Rutland health officer Wednesday.

A Jeffersonville man has offered to give a building lot free to the first man who will build a residence costing at least \$2,500 on a new street to be opened there.

The Williamstown Board of Trade has filed articles of association with the secretary of state. There is no capital stock, but the organization is authorized to receive gifts.

Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Ladd observed their 50th wedding anniversary in East Roxbury March 4. They received over \$100 in gold, as well as many other appropriate gifts.

C. A. St. John and son, Bradley, of Castleton, have just finished the season of ice fishing, having secured 41 pike and 150 pickerel; total weight, 451 pounds, the largest pike weighing nine pounds and the largest pickerel weighing 11 pounds.

A group of farmers meeting in Swanton Tuesday night voted to start a co-operative creamery there. A survey had already been made, the results showing that about 40 farmers, owning 968 cows, had pledged themselves to buy stock in and support a creamery.

Mrs. M. F. Pierce, a resident of Grand Isle for many years and now 83 years old and in a hospital near Cambridge, Mass., has presented to the Grand Isle library 500 books, which are to be known as the Charles Fay Memorial library. Rev. Charles Fay was the father of Mrs. Pierce.

Artemas and Rufus Houghton, brothers, who live in Brattleboro, were arrested March 12 on the charge of having stolen eight hens and a rooster belonging to Ray Mather of Marlboro the day before Thanksgiving. They pleaded not guilty and furnished bail of \$100 each to appear later at trial.

Rev. I. M. Compton, pastor of the West Brattleboro Baptist church, tendered his resignation March 12 to the trustees, intending to close his pastorate there April 6 and enter upon his duties Easter Sunday at the St. Albans church in Brandon. Mr. Compton has been in West Brattleboro five years, and has had three calls under consideration.

Joseph G. Hoyt of St. Albans, an engineer on the Central Vermont railroad, is recovering from injuries which he received in the St. Albans yards March 11. He was cut about the left side of the head; half of the ear being taken off. Mr. Hoyt runs the switching engine and it is supposed he was leaning out of the cab window and was hit by a projection from a car standing on an adjoining track.

Between 400 and 500 bushels of peas changed hands in North Hero within the past 10 days at \$3.50 a bushel, having been purchased by local buyers. At this time a year ago they would have brought twice the money they did now. Some farmers in the vicinity of North Hero have 200 or 300 bushels on hand, which they are holding in hopes of getting higher prices later.

The trustees of the Green Mountain club held a meeting in Rutland Wednesday and re-elected all the officers of the club for the ensuing year. The sum of \$300 was appropriated for work on the Long trail, with the expectation that local sections of the club throughout the state would provide \$1,000 more. The Long trail will be finished between Mount Killington and the Massachusetts line.
