### WILSON TALKED WITH JAPANESE

Had Conference With Baron Makino and Viscount Chinda

KAIO CHAU PROBABLY UNDER DISCUSSION

Belgian Indemnities Were Considered by Council of Three

Paris, April 29.—Before the meeting of the council of three this morning President Wilson received Baron Makino, head of the Japanese mission, and Viscount Chinda, his colleague. Their conference lasted nearly an hour. Presumably the question of Kaiou Chau was under discussion.

The council at the beginning of its session received a committee from the Belgian cabinet and gave it a hearing regarding the question of indemnities.

Lucius Webb and Mrs. Ann Moulton, Two Old Residents, Dead.

The death of Mrs. Ann Moulton occurred at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Ben Briggs, at Hartford, where she had been for the winter. Mrs. Moulton closed her rooms here in the early winter and went to spend the cold weather with her daughter, and while she had been rather poorly for a time, her death came suddenly. Mrs. Moulton was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Rufus Chadwick, and if she had lived till July would have been 84 years of age. Nearly all of her life was passed here, she having married George Moulton, and for years they lived on a farm on Fish hill. Deceased is survived by one brother, Silas Chadwick, and one sister, Mrs. Melissa Chadwick, and the daughter, Mrs. Briggs, with whom she lived this winter, and one son, William Moulton, a Pullman car conductor, with headquarters in Boston. The body was brought here by the son and daughter on Monday and interment was in the Moulton cemetery beside her husband, who died many years ago. Mrs. Moulton was a very pleasing woman with many friends, who will miss her greatly.

The death of Lucius Webb came on Wednesday morning after weeks of suffering, from which there seemed to be no relief. Mr. Webb was at the sanatorium for several weeks, but, there being no help there, was taken home to East Granville, where for weeks, he has been in extreme suffering. Deceased has been a very prominent business man in this vicinity for years and will be greatly missed in these circles. He was a man of good judgment and had an extensive experience, which caused him to be a safe adviser for all. In addition to this he sympathized with all who were in trouble and thus endeared himself to many. He was a member of the Masonic bodies in town, a past patron of Beulah chapter, where he held that office for seven years, was a member of the Shrine at Montpelier, and a member of Charlotte Morris East Matrons' and Patrons' association in the state. Deceased is survived by his wife and three children, Lieut. Commander DeWitt Webb of Charleston, N. C., Mrs. Arthur Hollins of Winchester, Mass., and Clarence Webb of East Granville, who has been with him constantly in his illness, and assisted in his care. It is understood that the funeral will be held on Thursday, Rev. Fraser Metzger officiating.

#### ONLY ONE CONTESTANT LEFT FOR ZBYZSKO

After Defeating "Strangler" Lewis Last Night He Must Face Sergeant Earl Caddock Before Securing Title of Champion.

Chicago, April 29.—Wladek Zbyzsko, the Polish wrestler, now has but one grappler to overcome in order to reach the championship, it was said today by followers of the sport. That one is Sergeant Earl Caddock of the American expeditionary forces, whose return from overseas is expected so soon that already there is talk of a match between the Pole and the soldier in July.

Zbyzsko clinched his right to be Caddock's challenger by defeating Ed (Strangler) Lewis, a second time in a match last night. The men wrestled two hours, 14 minutes and nine seconds, the end coming suddenly with a side roll and body scissors after a head lock—the seventh Lewis had secured during the match—had slipped.

By the terms of the match one fall was to decide the contest if no fall was procured within two hours.

### WOULD RETURN TEL. & TEL. LINES

Postmaster-General Recommends They Be Restored to Private Owners

IN COMMUNICATION TO PRESIDENT WILSON

As Soon as Congress Can Enact the Legislation Deemed Necessary

Washington, D. C., April 29.—Postmaster General Burleson has recommended to President Wilson that all telephone and telegraph lines be returned to their private owners as soon as Congress can enact legislation deemed necessary.

This action was announced yesterday shortly after the postmaster general had disclosed that he had recommended the immediate return of American cable lines and hoped to have the cables in the hands of their owners by May 10.

#### BURLESON WANTS TO DROP THE CABLES

Asks President to Let Him Restore the American Lines to Private Ownership by May 10.

Washington, D. C., April 29.—President Wilson has been asked by Postmaster General Burleson to approve the immediate return of American cable lines to their private owners. In announcing his action yesterday, the postmaster general said he hoped restoration of the properties could be effected by May 10.

The following statement was issued: "The postmaster general has recommended to the president that the government return the cable lines to their respective owners. This action is made possible by the fact that the congestion resulting from war conditions has largely passed. The many commercial blacklists has been abolished and the tremendous volume of government cable messages from and to the war trade board has ceased. The bar to commercial code messages has been removed, thus materially lessening the cable loads. The use of the cables in connection with the peace conference has been greatly diminished.

"The postmaster general hopes that the return of the cables may be effective not later than May 10."
