KILL SOME PEOPLE TO CURE OTHERS

Followers of Elocua Believe That God Can Come to One Person Only Through Injury to Another—At Least Three Innocent Children and Six Voodoo Slain.

Havana, Cuba, Aug. 6 (Correspondence of the Associated Press).—With the recent sudden outbreak of cannibalistic practices by Voodoo worshippers, which have resulted in the deaths of at least three innocent children and a half dozen of the Voodoos, the latter by the application of "lynch" law for the first time in the country's history, fathers and mothers are living in constant fear that their little ones may be spirited away by the superstitious negroes to be offered up in sacrifice to "Chango," the god of the "Brujos," as they are called in the Castilian language.

SPECIAL PRIZES AT STATE FAIR.

Exhibitors Much Interested in Liberal Offers Made by Individuals and Associations. Exhibitors are finding much of interest in the special prizes that will be awarded at the Vermont state fair, to be held at White River Junction, Sept. 9, 10, 11 and 12. These specials are in addition to the regular premiums offered by the fair itself. In the cattle department E. A. Darling of East Burke offers \$25, \$15 and \$10 to the best herd of registered Jerseys owned in Vermont, the herd to consist of one bull under two years, one yearling heifer, one two-year-old heifer, and one three-year-old heifer. John G. Howland of Quechee Falls, offers \$15 and \$10 for the best group of registered Jerseys consisting of one calf, either sex, under one year, one yearling heifer, one two-year-old heifer (in milk), one cow over three and under five years. The Vermont Jersey Cattle club offers a silver cup valued at \$25 for the best young herd of registered Jerseys owned and exhibited by a Vermontor, consisting of one heifer calf over six but under 12 months, one heifer over 12 but under 24 months, one bull under 12 months. The Ayrshire Breeders' association offers a silver cup or medal to be awarded to the exhibitor who shall win most money on single animals bred by himself. The exhibitor must be a member of the Ayrshire Breeders' association and the cattle entered by him for competition must be recorded in the Ayrshire Record and stand on the books of the association as owned by him. The American Guernsey Cattle club offers a silver trophy to the premier breeder, the trophy to be held by winner until one month previous to the next Vermont state fair, when it is to be returned to the secretary of the fair to be again competed for. It will become the permanent property of the person winning it twice. The American Hereford Cattle Breeders' association will increase the Hereford premiums 50 per cent in addition to the premiums offered by the Vermont state fair. These premiums will be paid direct by the American Hereford Cattle Breeders' association upon receipt of report giving the awards of the fair. A. P.
