Happenings of Interest from Different Sections.

Egbert E. Brason, 87, an employee of the Eskey Organ company in Brattleboro for more than 40 years, died at his home in that town last week of a general breaking down due to his advanced age. A few years ago he withdrew from active labor on account of poor health.

William Labelle, 11 years old, has admitted to the Burlington police that he is the one who has been setting fires in that city for the past two months. He gave as his reason for setting them that he liked to see the flames. He has already been in the reform school.

Burlington people have been large purchasers of the government foodstuffs through the postoffice, over \$2,500 worth having been disposed of since the sale began and the demand being so great that the postmaster has asked for further consignments of many things, which have been completely disposed of.

Two small deer have been shot in open zones in Rutland county within the past few days. Fay M. Anderson of Wallingford getting one in the zone about the J. A. Stewart orchard and Mr. Stevens, an employee of the Rutland railway, Light & Power company at Mendon station. Neither deer was full grown.

Large Sale of Valuable Shorthorn Cattle. Indicative of the great interest manifested among Shorthorn breeders for their favorite breed comes word of a large transaction which was consummated last week at Greatwood, at Plainfield, the home of Willard S. Martin. Here had been assembled from many states prominent breeders to attend the meeting of the New England Milking Shorthorn Breeders' association Friday. Two of Mr. Martin's guests bought and sold 55 pure-bred Shorthorn heifers, involving a very large sum. This was probably the largest cattle transaction which has occurred in the state of Vermont in a long time.
