

### SERIOUS FIRE IN CONCORD N. H.

White Opera House, Four-Story Brick Structure, Destroyed

### CONCORD PATRIOT WAS BURNED OUT

Chamber of Commerce and Republican State Committee Had Offices

Concord, N. H., Nov. 30.—Fire early this morning practically destroyed White's opera house block, with a loss estimated at \$150,000. The bulk of the loss fell upon Edward J. Gallagher, publisher of the Concord Daily Patriot and owner of the block, but the Concord chamber of commerce, the Republican state committee, occupants of offices, Robert W. Kimball, barber, Charles H. Rowe, automobile supplies, and C. P. Dame, fruit dealer, suffered losses that will be virtually total.

The offices, press and composing rooms of the Daily Patriot on the ground floor, were touched little, if at all by the flames, but books, equipment and machinery was ruined or badly damaged by water.

The block also contained White's opera house, the oldest theatre in the city, in which some of the best known plays in America had appeared. The fire started in the theatre property room, where a local performance was given last night.

British Cabinet Approves Anglo-Russian Proposals

### MATTER NOW SENT ON TO MOSCOW

Leonid Krassin Telegraphs Text of the Proposals

Paris, Nov. 30.—Proposals by Great Britain as a basis for the Anglo-Russian commercial treaty, which have been approved by the British cabinet, were handed to Leonid Krassin, head of the Russian bolshevik trade mission in London, last night, says a dispatch to the Journal. He immediately telegraphed the text of the proposals to Moscow.

### LIQUOR SEIZED ON TRAIN

Forty Bottles Taken from Montreal-Boston Sleeper.

St. Albans, Nov. 30.—Forty bottles of whiskey were seized from train No. 6 Sunday night, the sleeper from Montreal to Boston. The whiskey was found under a mattress and two men were occupying the berth, George Boyle of Methuen, Mass., and Joseph Boyie of Lawrence, Mass. The seizure was made by W. R. H. Davidson, deputy collector of customs at this port. He took the men from the train and they are here yet in the city, awaiting a hearing.




