THREE OF "DRY" FORCES SLAIN

But Enforcement Agents Came Out Victorious in Mountain Battle

WITH MOONSHINE GANG IN KENTUCKY

Moonshine Leader Dead; Another Wounded and Five Arrested

Lexington, Ky., Dec. 16.—Menifee county's "moonshine war" had ended to-day, after a week of campaigning in the hill country. Federal prohibition enforcement forces emerged victors, but not until three agents had been slain in clashes with the outlaws.

To balance their losses, the federal men to-day counted Robert Ballard, leader of the moonshiners, dead; his brother, Charles, wounded and a fugitive in the hills and Ed Ballard, father, and Albert Ballard, brother, of the slain leader, together with Joseph Clem, William Ferguson and Henry Rollit prisoners in jail here.

The Menifee county outbreak ended yesterday in the same fashion it started a week ago—a spectacular gun battle.

LIQUOR RETURNED.

Because Captured Outside of 3-Mile Limit.

New York, Dec. 16.—A band of prohibition enforcement agents, yesterday placed 1208 cases of whiskey and twenty barrels of miscellaneous liquors aboard the schooner Marion Moscher, soon to sail for St. Pierre, Miquelon.

The Moscher, which flies the British flag, recently was captured by the dry navy. Prohibition officials said last night the vessel had been ordered released because the capture had been made outside the three mile limit.

PROTEST EXPULSION.

Of Head of Greek Church from Constantinople.

New York, Dec. 16.—Protestant Episcopal Bishops William T. Manning of New York and Thomas F. Gaylor of Tennessee have sent joint telegrams to Secretary of State Hughes and to Richard Washburn Child, American ambassador to Italy, urging that steps be taken to prevent expulsion of the head of the Greek church from Constantinople because of the religious and political situation.

BRITISH WAR CRAFT MORE NUMEROUS

Figures Given to Show Why House Committee Seeks to Get New International Agreement.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 16 (By the Associated Press).—A tabulation obtained to-day in naval circles showing the relative positions of the British, American and Japanese navies in cruiser and submarine strength apparently shed light on the situation which led the House appropriations committee to propose that President Harding negotiate an international agreement to check competitive building in these types.

The figures credit Great Britain with 45 light cruisers of the first line, built, building or projected, and aggregating 296,480 tons; the United States with ten ships building, 75,000 tons and Japan with 11 ships built and 21 building and projected aggregating 191,450 tons. In addition, the list shows Great Britain to have 13 light cruisers of the second line, 60,230 tons, neither the United States nor Japan being credited with any ships in this classification.

In fleet submarines Great Britain is credited with six of the first line, 11,290 tons, six of the second line, 7,200 tons and two building or projected, 3,800 tons; the United States with three of the first line built, 3,318 tons, none of the second line, three building, 6,375 tons, and six additional authorized but not under contract; Japan with no fleet submarines built but three under construction, 4,500 tons.

In first line submarines other than fleet submarines, Great Britain is credited with 42 built, 33,740 tons, and six building, 5,550 tons; the United States with 50 built, 37,120 tons, 34 building, 29,575 tons; Japan with 27 built, 23,238 tons and one program of sixteen building, 13,480 tons and a second building program of 28 vessels (tonnage unknown). While the tables showed decided American inferiority in light cruisers, the United States has a distinct advantage in first line destroyers with 295 built against 170 for Great Britain and 54 for Japan.

Six new destroyers are given on the British program, none on the American and 38 on the Japanese.


