EDITOR'S CORRESPONDENCE.

FAYETTEVILLE, February 27.

I reached here this afternoon at 6 o'clock by a route new to me, coming up the North Carolina road as far as S. Ma. I struck at that place the Wilson "Short Cut" to extend from Wilson, on the Wilmington and Weldon railroad to Florence, S. C., intended to avoid the great detour by way of Wilmington, but only completed as far as this place, forty miles from Selma. It is a very excellent road, and though new, runs very smoothly, and with a fairly fast schedule.

The Cape Fear river, a mile or two above the town, is crossed by a fine and high wooden bridge, and soon after leaving it, the outskirts, once very familiar to me, were entered and quickly traversed, and I alighted at the depot in the center of the place in which I was born and grew up to meet not a single face I knew.

So far I have not yet learned whether I am altogether forgotten, or to note the changes that have taken place in the material character of the town, with one or two exceptions. The hotel at which I stop, the Hotel La Fayette, is really a fine building, handsome in architecture and admirable in its interior arrangements.

Fayetteville has had an eventful history and is quite old for an American town. It dates back nearly to the '45. The battle of Colleton, fought on the 12th of April, 1746, closed with the defeat of Charles Edward, the pretender. The conqueror, the Duke of Cumberland, at royal command, and with the full assent of his own hard nature, determined there should be no more rebellions, and that there should be no more materials for one.

In connection with the efforts made by Fayetteville to retrieve her fallen fortunes, it may not be amiss to refer to the plank road system, which was of such easy construction in a pine timbered country, that when its feasibility was demonstrated, the people of the town with one voice shouted eneka, they were about to find their way out of the woods. A gentleman from Western New York, whose name I do not recall, came here from Syracuse and told how much plank roads had done for that city.
