

DOCTORS HAVE A HARD ROW TO HOE

The M. D.'s Want to Hew in Pleasant Lines with the Druggists in Durham, It Seems.

To THE EDITOR—The attention of the Durham Academy of Medicine has been called to an article in Saturday evening's GLOBE in regard to the doctors and their efforts to prevent "counter prescribing" by druggists, and we, as president and secretary of the academy, were instructed to correct errors which are published therein.

In the first place, the object of the meeting of the 18th inst. (last night) was to discuss the relation between the doctor and the druggist and bring about an amicable settlement of seeming differences.

So far as administering a simple remedy for a temporary trouble to a suffering patient by the druggist, no one raises the slightest objection. Indeed, we think that he should do so. But we do think that the druggist exceeds his powers when a patient is regularly examined, his disease diagnosed, and remedies administered for a continued period. The druggist is not supposed to be capable of understanding enough of the human system
