The races, both horse and motorcycle, will be important parts of the fair's attractions. This contest will furnish rare and exciting sport.

Up to-date free attractions will be held in front of the grandstand day and night. Band concerts will be a daily sensation. Amusements, instruction and pleasure will be evenly blended.

The midway will be up to the minute.

THE BIG STATE FAIR

Replete with many new and brilliant events that have never before been included in Fair Week festivities, the great State Fair of nineteen fifteen seems destined to eclipse any of its predecessors.

Many and wonderful are the free attractions headed by the most spectacular aeroplane stunt shown in America. Capt Worden, who Colonel Roosevelt praised for his daring, will give a realistic exhibition of an aeroplane attacking a fort. From a height of two thousand feet he will hurl real high explosive bombs on a solid fort below. The fort will return the fire until it is demolished in a cloud of smoke and dust. It is a vivid touch of real warfare. Besides this, there are many other splendid attractions including Cotton's Comedy Donkeys, the Skating Bear, The Human Loop the Loop fifty feet in midair, etc.

A new feature of this year's Fair, and one that is sure to prove one of the best, as the grand Floral and Industrial parade under the direction of the Raleigh Rotary Club and the review of the National Guard by General Young and Staff.

For the agriculturalist there will be the competitive County Exhibits, made up of blue ribbon winners from the country fairs, Boys' and Girls' Corn Clubs, Poultry Club, Tomato Clubs and Pig Clubs. Another new feature which will add interest to this, is the Motion Pic-

ture Exhibit of the treatment of the diseases of cattle and poultry, furnished by the United States government.

For the mothers, there is the Better Babies' Contest, under the direction of the Woman's Club of Raleigh.

This is but part of the score of things that should bring you to the Fair—October 12-23. Begin to plan your trip now and be sure to go.
