### Seventeen Transfers Are Placed on Record

Money Involved Totals Approximately \$45,000—Many High Point Deeds.

A total of 17 realty transfers involving approximately \$45,000 were filed in the office of Register of Deeds R. H. Wharton yesterday. Ten of the transfers were of High Point property. Only two were of Greensboro real estate.

One of Greensboro's two, however, was the most important transaction recorded during the course of the day. Harry S. Donnell transferred to H. M. Chamblee his residence on Wainman street for a consideration, as indicated by revenue stamps attached to the document, of approximately \$20,000.

Sealed proposals will be received by the City Council of the City of High Point, at the office of the City Manager of the City of High Point in said City, until Friday, April 15th, at 12 o'clock, noon, when they will be publicly opened, for the purchase of \$175,000 Funding Bonds of said City, of the denomination of \$1,000 each, dated April 15, 1921, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually on April 15th and October 15th, and maturing serially. \$8,000 of bonds on April 15th in each of the years 1924 to 1926, inclusive, \$10,000 of bonds on

April 15th in each of the years 1927 to 1931, inclusive, and \$21,000 of bonds on April 15, 1936. Said bonds will be coupon bonds, with the privilege of conversion into fully registered bonds. Principal and interest will be payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at The Hanover National Bank, New York City, N. Y.
