PARKER ANNOUNCES HE WILL OPPOSE HUGHES

New Orleans, Sept. 30.—John M. Parker, Progressive vice presidential nominee, said here that he had written Wendell Phillips Colby, a Progressive leader, stating that he was willing to be used "in whatever way appeared best" and that when he went to New York he would speak against the candidacy of Charles E. Hughes.

"Of course that would be in favor of Mr. Wilson," said Mr. Parker, "but I will speak as a Progressive and not as an affirmative supporter of the Democratic nominee."

Mr. Parker reiterated that he preferred Mr. Wilson over Mr. Hughes but he said he did not expect to speak under the auspices of the Democratic campaign committee.


