SCARLET FEVER

Prevalent in Many Sections of State. Danger of Contagion

Many schools in different sections of the state have been forced to suspend work on account of the appearance of scarlet fever in severe form.

There were nearly twice as many deaths in 1915 from this disease in North Carolina as from infantile paralysis—that is, reported cases. The great majority of fatalities from scarlet fever are reported as nephritis (Bright's disease).

Scarlet fever is always serious. Even when a little patient recovers from an attack of the disease itself, the complications which often follow may cause lasting damage to different parts of the body. Some of the worst forms of deafness result from an attack of scarlet fever. Many serious cases of heart disease result directly from an attack of scarlet fever. The kidney complications are frequent and, besides doing permanent damage, cause death in a large percentage of cases.

Every case of scarlet fever is evidence of negligence on the part of someone in caring for a previous case, because the only known source of the disease is a scarlet fever patient, from whom the germ passes in some way and again sets up an attack in a susceptible person.

One of the most important things for people to know about scarlet fever is that even the mild cases are exceedingly dangerous. Often a mild attack is followed by some fatal complication. This is especially true of that involving the kidneys.

Remember that not only is the disease always dangerous, but easily given to others. A child not sick enough to go to bed may give the disease to another in fatal form.



SCARLET FEVER, HOW TO CONTROL ITS SPREAD.

Scarlet fever is one of the most dangerous diseases to childhood. There is no preventive serum or vaccine or antitoxin as in many other diseases. The only known method of control is rigid quarantine and isolation of a patient ill with the disease. Knowing this and knowing its danger and its insidious character, there are absolutely no rules and regulations governing the control of this disease in seven out of ten counties in the state.

Who is to blame for this state of affairs? Chiefly the so-called county physicians. It is his duty to have the county board of health adopt proper quarantine rules under the general state law; and then he should enforce them without fear or favor. It is the duty of the county authorities to furnish the funds to defray the cost of this work.

The commissioners of seventy North Carolina counties still place a higher value on the property of their citizens than on the lives of their little ones.

Every sudden illness with fever or sore throat in a child should be considered dangerous until a good doctor says there is no danger.

Remember that scarletina is scarlet fever. There must be proper regulations with a man to enforce them in every county; and there must be a systematic search of every case, mild, missed or concealed and placing it under control before the spread of the disease can be controlled.
