 most honorable living a man can,  
 which is farming. Crops in this  
 section are a little late but are  
 looking fine. Small grain is very  
 good.

This is a hustling country and  
 if you don't start two hours  
 ahead of time and then make up  
 a little Sunday you are just one  
 hour too late. You know some  
 of the time is run up an hour  
 ahead of the Sun God and every-  
 thing else, but some of us get  
 there when we get ready, let it  
 be fast or slow, soon or late and  
 we make about as good crops as  
 the fast fellows. People in this  
 country are living well; lots of  
 farmers selling corn, hogs and  
 bacon, and plenty of renters and  
 tenants have boodle in the bank  
 and about all from a one-horse  
 tenant has a car to ride in. The  
 cotton mill at Red Springs is  
 running in full blast day and  
 night and is adding greatly to  
 the business of Red Springs and  
 surrounding country, affording a  
 good market for any thing we
