

HANCOCK'S LETTER.

New York, July 23.—The Express says: It was rumored to-day that Gen. Hancock's letter of acceptance would be issued this evening, but at 3 o'clock this afternoon it was definitely learned from a source which may be regarded as fully authentic, that his letter will not be furnished to the public to-day.

1. That the president's duties are chiefly executive and therefore as a soldier-act in obedience to superior authority, the president must obey the constitution as the supreme law of the land, and obey and enforce the laws of congress, whose duty it is to repeal laws when it is found that they have become obnoxious.

2. That the political results of the war must be accepted and upheld in good faith, and the constitutional amendments for the purpose of insuring the success thereof must be fully respected.

3. The broadest democratic ground will be taken on the Chinese question, that Columbia is an asylum and home for the oppressed of all lands, but will not tolerate the enslavement of labor in any foreign or local contract.

4. That the president's duty to make recommendations to congress is to be pursued in no narrow, but in a thoroughly patriotic sense, and as local interests may conflict, the duty of reconciling matters over which the sections may dispute belongs to congress, the law-making power.

ARMY NOTES. Col. W. H. Wood, 11th infantry, has been relieved from duty on the general court martial convened at Fort Keogh.

One hundred and six recruits have been ordered to Bismarck, Dakota, for assignment to the 18th infantry.

Brigadier Gen. C. C. Anger has been detailed as a member of the board of officers appointed to examine and report upon the qualifications of the regulations of the army.

Capt. E. E. Grimes, assistant quartermaster, having reported at Whipple barracks, Prescott, Arizona, has been appointed as chief quartermaster of the department of Arizona.

The following changes in the stations and duties of officers of the pay department are announced: Major W. A. Rucker, paymaster, is relieved from duty in the department of the Missouri and ordered to report to the commanding general department of Dakota for duty as chief paymaster of that department.
