A GREAT MAN'S TROUBLES.

General Hancock Besieged by all Sorts of Nuisances.

New York Telegram to Globe-Democrat. According to information from Governor's Island, Gen. Hancock is getting heartily tired of his present company. An intimate friend of the general arrived here to-day, having made him a long visit. He says that he is much distressed by the intolerable nuisance of the supererogable zeal and jealousy of the democratic leaders and the intolerable nuisance and importunities of petty politicians and rebel brigades. It appears that they crowd over by the first boat in the morning and hang around headquarters all day, annoying the general and interfering with the discipline of the island. The democratic committee hold a special meeting and then adjourn for Governor's Island to sit out the day. During his visit the gentlemen alluded to fell into conversation with one of the political loungers, who was a rebel brigadier. He says he asked how the southern people could support Hancock, who had taken a hand in whipping them. The brigadier answered: "We will overlook that. We wish now to lick the Yankees. His sympathies are with us, and if we get in we will show what we will do." The gentleman says that the general invited him into his private office where he kept something for his friends, and while there the buzz of voices outside attracting his attention, the general remarked: "Do you see those fellows out there?" Looking through the open window and spying the rebel brigadier and a half a dozen others conversing loudly, the gentleman replied: "Yes, they are quite earnest." The general, continuing, said: "They are worse than Gettysburg." This gentleman says that Hancock is annoyed to petulance by this crowd. He is ashamed to be seen with them, and has no refuge short of cutting off communication with the main land. At the time English was on hand, and had been bothering the general with a political disquisition on the true policy of the democracy. Maj. Norton, of McMahon's sympathy of the general's staff, is acting as a sort of self-appointed major-domo, and look after the invading political hordes from the mainland with accustomed magnificence.

EDISON'S ELECTRIC ENGINE.

There was unusual activity in Menlo Park yesterday, Mr. Edison having his whole force at work on the perfection of his new electric engine. He has a track built on his land there, and a Graphic reporter was given a flying trip of half a mile. The engine took around curves, up and down grades at a high rate of speed, apparently able to do all that its inventor claims for it. Mr. Edison intends continuing the track, making a circuit of three miles and returning to the starting place. There will be several very steep grades, one of 800 feet to the mile and another of the remarkable grade of 2,600 feet to the mile. There will also be some exceedingly sharp curves, one of thirty feet radius.

In three weeks he intends running five freight cars, weighing together about twenty-five tons, up and down this grade of 800 feet, when he will have completed a "gripper" which is to be fastened to the fore part of the engine, increasing the tractive power and preventing accidents in going down grades. He is having built by the Southwark Foundry company, Philadelphia, a 100-horse power electric engine, which he intends running between Rahway and Perth Amboy, a distance of about eight miles.
